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RECROSS EXAMINATION BY MR. FIKRE:

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Q. Mr. Turcott, are you aware of a van that can sit up to ten people also qualifies as a limousine?

A. There is a limousine -- under the DOL limousine laws, there is a limousine classification as a -- I believe it's an executive van, and the limousine permits allows up to 14 passengers behind the driver, so a van, executive van, under -- if I'm quoting DOL's regulations accurately, can take up to 14. The issue with auto trans is that when there's shared ride, when there's individual seats, you know, transportation is sold by the seat. In other words, the offer that I had was \$17 per person. A limousine can only be booked under a single contract for the entire vehicle, so to offer -for a limousine company to be selling tickets or transportation point to point between fixed termini on a per seat basis is not authorized under the DOL rules. That is auto transportation and requires a certificate from the Commission.

- Q. And as far as the body of the e-mail, you felt comfortable taking the first part of the e-mail over the -- the last part of the e-mail; correct?
- A. I don't understand your question, sir.
- Q. The first part of the e-mail states it was \$17

ISAIAH FIKRE, having been first duly sworn by the hearing judge, testified as follows:

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JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. So what is your response to the allegations against you?

MR. FIKRE: It is not accurate. I think it's somewhat misleading. I do have -- I do have a company that's called Sound Express, LLC, which was formed years to years ago, and the reason why that was formed was for the simple fact that when I realized that there is a need for -- for a different market under different license that UTC wouldn't -- wouldn't allow me to operate, so I went ahead and started the company to be able to accommodate small groups and so forth.

And in the past, that is true. Puget Express, you know, we have advertised our rates per person, and amongst other violations, that wasn't intentional, and for that -- and, you know, for all those reasons combined, the company was -- you know, we were told to stop, and we did.

And in the process of doing that, it took a lot of resources, a lot of money, a lot of time, and, you know, I've been working with agencies that are familiar with the UTC's rules and regulations to -- to stay on top of the compliance. And it's been -- it's been, you

A. I'm -- I'm taking the e-mails at their face value, and I'll let the judge, you know, evaluate those. I have -- I have an offer for transportation for a group of six at \$17 per person, and then I have an offer for a van -- to charter the van for the whole group for a group of eight.

Q. Okay. Thank you.

A. So I'm presenting that to the Commission for them to decide on.

Q. Okay. Thank you.

A. I take -- I take the e-mails at face value.

Q. Thank you. I appreciate that.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. So, Mr. Fikre, it's your turn to present your testimony.

MR. FIKRE: Yes.

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know, almost a year, and I have a letter that I can present to you showing that I have been working and trying to get in compliance.

However, I think the -- the Commission has failed to realize that, first of all, this e-mail right here, I have to admit, it was something my wife had replied and, you know, tried to get me -- you know, tried to kind of help me out a little bit. I always tell her to get, you know, their information -- any customer's information first, you know, name and phone number, to be able to understand their needs and give them their rate. And so in the beginning of the e-mail, I believe -- yeah. Yeah, my wife had sent an e-mail in regards to trying to reach out to the client who posed -- the client in this matter to discuss the information details, and no information was provided, never responded with the phone number for me to reach out, and so she went ahead and replied \$17 a person, and -- which I was not happy with that because I'm aware that we don't -- you know, we don't -- we don't offer prices -- we don't charge per person. It's a flat rate.

So -- but a month before -- a month prior to UTC's notice in regards to this matter, I went ahead and responded to an e-mail that preceded -- the number of people went from six to eight, and then I responded

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myself, clearly stating that it is -- you know, that it is a flat rate. It didn't matter if it was, you know, two people or ten people. It is a flat rate. And I stated so there.

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And I -- if you don't mind, I have some information I would like to share with you. Unfortunately, I didn't make any other copy, so basically, what I have here is -- if you don't mind, number one, I have a letter from -- from the company VATA Safety Training & Compliance, showing that I've been working with them for almost a year. We're almost ready to submit our application with UTC. Number 2, be more specific in this matter, I do have a license for Sound Express, LLC, showing that it is a limousine company and there are vehicles that are active in there, along with insurance for each and every vehicle listed, as well as how we -- how we present our information at every hotel, every -- you know, every hotel we work with throughout the Puget Sound. This is put in a folder like this stating the prices for town cars, SUVs, and

So mistakes do happen here and there, but, you know, I do -- you know, I don't have -- I don't have any intention to be able to advertise in a way that we have done in the past. Clearly that was a violation. I paid

So it's just a small mistake that happened, but, like I said, I think towards the end, it was corrected, so -- and for that, I'm sorry about that, but I think, you know -- you know, I'm doing anything and everything that I can to -- to comply and correct, you know, mistakes that I've done in the past, but, you know, that's -- that's pretty much what I have to say.

You also heard in evidence that that was originally offered at a per

person rate and that when circumstances changed, that

less than 17. Eight people, it comes out to be 17. And, you know, due to the number of -- to the amount of luggage that a group might have, six, seven people can fit in the SUV. You know, even up to five people, if they have tons of luggage, they would have to upgrade to a van because of the luggage issue.

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So the \$17 per person that was communicated in that, like I said, that was a mistake. You know, even though I still take responsibilities for the simple fact that my wife responded to that, but I took responsibility enough to be able to correct that in the end and let her know that it is a flat rate.

And -- and, again, I have been doing business as Sound Express and this was a former, you know -- a previously created company before Puget Express was shut down, and I take offense to the fact that I'm being labelled as someone who is operating as Puget Express. Like I said, I have every intention to comply, however long it takes to get it right with UTC, and to be at a operating, you know, level. However, right now, the complaint is against a company that's been dead.

I'm trying to provide, which take a lot of time and a lot of resources, but I'm finding my limousine license -- I'm finding myself here today to defend my limousine license, which clearly, you know, has nothing

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rate was consistently applied to the new amount of persons that was discussed. You've also heard evidence

that Mr. Fikre is the operations manager of Puget

and Puget Express -- or Puget Sound [sic] do not possess

And when the gentleman here asked me about the -- of the rate of \$17 per person would amount to \$136 for eight people, it does; however, then, you know, on my -- the way I set up my business is, for

20 instance -- in that particular case, it does look like 21 \$17 a person, but they could have up to ten people,

22 which clearly shows on there on the flier that I'm

23 giving you, you can have up to ten people and still be

24 \$136, and so if you do the math, \$136 divided by ten is 25

going to be less than 17. Nine people, it's going to be

to do with UTC.

At the same time, I also want to make sure -- in closing, I want to share this with you: My knowledge of the violations that I've made with UTC left me with enough knowledge to make sure even though I'm operating under a limousine license, to make sure that I don't violate UT -- the -- the UTC rules and regulations. Just because I'm operating under a town car/limo service, it doesn't mean I will carry on doing business that will violate, you know, UTC. Some day when I get up to date, I would want someone to respect that. And I've done everything that I can in my power to make sure it's not violated. And the company that's not happy with doing business, they're not just losing business because I happen to be in business. There are over 3,000 companies that operate under a limousine license. On top of that, there's Uber, Lyfts and all of that. And one of the e-mails will show you that the hotels that we work with, they're not strictly using us. They're also using Seattle Express, Uber, Lyft amongst, you know, as well taxi cabs and for hires, so thank you

for taking the time and I'm done. JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Thank you. So I -the regulations require that I issue a decision within ten days. I would like -- since there was so much
