JUDGE HOWARD: Let's be on the record. Good
morning, everyone. Today is Wednesday, April 8th, 2020,
and the time is 9:30 a.m.
This is Docket TV-200137. This is a case by

This is Docket TV-200137. This is a case by whether the Commission should grant an exemption to its regulations and grant an application for a household goods moving permit. The notice of intent to deny application states that Let's Move It did not contest the Commission's cancellation of its permit for failure to maintain insurance in order to seek reinstatement on this permit within 30 days.

As such, the company is normally barred by the terms of the Administrative Code 480-15-302, Paragraph 11, from reapplying for authority for 12 months. The company in its reply is requesting an exemption from that rule.

My name is Michael Howard, and I am the administrative law judge presiding over today's brief adjudicative proceeding.

Let's take appearances from both parties and

I will then allow Ms. Behrends to testify and present her case, and we can end the hearing by allowing each party to give a closing statement, which is simply a chance to explain what you're asking the Commission to do and why.

A. My name is Patrick Remfrey, P-a-t-r-i-c-k, last name R-e-m, as in Michael, f, as in Frank, r-e-y.

### Q. Who is your employer?

A. I'm employed by the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission and specifically I work in licensing.

### Q. What is your specific position in licensing?

A. I am a transportation specialist 3 and I handle the regulated companies' applications, that would include household goods orders.

# Q. So does Staff oppose the company's request for an exemption?

A. No, Staff does not oppose their request for exemption. When we identified that it had been 44 days since the permit was cancelled from -- let's see, cancelled on I believe it was January 16th, and then we received the application on February 28th, when we identified that, we wanted to be able to approve the application; however, by the law, we had to deny following the WAC to bring it to this point to be -- you know, to take through the exemption request the proper way through the law to be able to permit them.

## So Staff has no concerns about the company's fitness or anything to operate?

A. No, no concerns about the company's fitness to operate. It appears just from -- from what I could tell that the initial insurance policy was a pretty short one, just to get operating, and it is a rough time to be trying to run a moving business and to start up throughout the winter. And so it's not surprising that it took a little while to be able to find another insurer when the first policy cancelled, and I think had we been -- made it more clear that she must reapply

#### Q. Fair enough.

And Staff has no indication that the company is otherwise violating the public service laws by operating without a permit or anything like that, correct?

A. Correct. We haven't heard any -- any word that the company was operating in the time between January 16th and today, at least moving household goods. She is permitted to perform general commodities moves. That -- anything in that interest if that permit was approved would have been legal.

# Q. And there have been no issues with Let's Move It's common carrier authority?

A. No, there were no issues. The insurance required to do common carrier is the same as what she needed to have for household goods, actually a little less requirements needed. But she had -- her policy was more than what was necessary, so we were able to approve that permit with no issues.

MR. ROBERSON: I have no further questions for Mr. Remfrey.

JUDGE HOWARD: Thank you.

Ms. Behrends, do you -- do you have any
