Dear Senator Kohl:

I am writing to you as a minority that being a single woman in business and working in a predominanty male oriented business. I have been harrassed by Mr. John Foster of the UTC, been followed, threatened to shut me down all because of a law that really isn't rational. It seems that as a moving company, I can move offices, and I can legally move in 7 areas of Seattle, but all other areas I am restricted. This is really a confusing law and needs to be addressed by the House and Senate and deregulated completely.

This law states that I can RENT a truck through a rental agency, go into a home and move it legally, but I cannot own the truck. This is completely absurd.

I know that there is a a license that I can apply for but the major moving companies have monopolized and put a hold on this license because like any industry, there is a low season and a peak season, so when you go into court with your license, they claim that they cannot employee all of their employees because of the season. This is not fair, because the larger moving companies want to control the market, and the middle class people, lower income people, and single parents, like myself, should be allowed to pick and choose the company based on price. This law is preventing me from my livlihood and needs to be deregulated. I need to get my license to move household goods, because Mr. John Foster, who is doing his job, will be able to shut me down thereby making it impossible for me to provide a living for myself and my employees.
