## TO ALL PARTIES AND INTERESTED PERSONS:

On January 21, 2004, Bonneville Power Administration (Bonneville) filed with the Commission a Petition for a Declaratory Order Disclaiming Jurisdiction. Specifically, Bonneville petitions for a declaratory order disclaiming jurisdiction under title 80 RCW over the owner lessor and the indenture trustee in Bonneville's proposed lease financing of certain electric transmission facilities to be used in interstate commerce, including a new transmission line in central Washington.
