- On September 20, 2004, Advanced TelCom, Inc. ("ATI"), AT&T Communications of the Pacific Northwest, Inc. and AT&T Local Services on behalf of TCG Seattle (collectively "AT&T"), MCImetro Access Transmission Services, LLC. ("MCI"), and United Communications, Inc., d/b/a UNICOM ("UNICOM"), collectively the Joint Petitioners, filed with the Commission a joint petition for enforcement of interconnection agreements with Verizon Northwest, Inc. The petition states that Verizon's elimination of CLEC access to unbundled elements violates the terms of the interconnection agreements. A more detailed account of the dispute is reflected in the petition, which is available for inspection at the Commission's office located at Chandler Plaza Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W., Olympia, Washington, and on the Commission's web site at <a href="https://www.wutc.wa.gov/041127">www.wutc.wa.gov/041127</a>.
- The Commission will hear this matter pursuant to Part IV of chapter 34.05 RCW pertaining to adjudicative proceedings, including but not limited to RCW 34.05.413, RCW 34.05.431, RCW 34.05.440, RCW 34.05.449, RCW 34.05.452, and WAC 480-07-650. The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to

Title 80 RCW, having legal authority to regulate the rates, services, and practices of telecommunications companies providing service within the state of Washington. Statutes involved, in addition to those previously cited, include those within chapters 80.01 RCW, 80.04 RCW, 80.36 RCW, 480-07 WAC, and 480-120 WAC, including but not limited to RCW 80.01.040 and RCW 80.04.020.

- The ultimate issues involved are generally stated above and more specifically contained in the petition.
- THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE That in accordance with WAC 480-07-440(1)(a), the Commission has determined that good cause exists for this matter to be heard on shortened notice.

The Commission will consider petitions to intervene made orally during the conference, but strongly prefers written petitions to intervene. In addition, party representatives must file notices of appearance with the

Commission, as required by WAC 480-07-345(2), no later than the day prior to the conference.
