- 1 NATURE OF PROCEEDING. Docket UG-060518 involves a request by Avista Corporation for authority to implement a mechanism to decouple its rates for conducting business operations, in part, from its rates for commodity sales.
- CONFERENCE. The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) convened a prehearing conference in this docket at Seattle, Washington on September 6, 2006, before Administrative Law Judges Patricia Clark and C. Robert Wallis.
- 3 APPEARANCES. David Meyer, attorney, Spokane, Washington, represents Avista Corporation (Avista). Simon ffitch, Assistant Attorney General, Seattle, Washington, represents the Public Counsel Section of the Washington Office of the Attorney General (Public Counsel). Donald T. Trotter, Assistant Attorney General, Olympia, Washington, represents the Commission's regulatory staff (Commission Staff or Staff).<sup>1</sup> Ron Roseman, attorney, Seattle, represents intervenor The Energy Project.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> In formal proceedings, such as this case, the Commission's regulatory staff functions as an independent party with the same rights, privileges, and responsibilities as any other party to the proceeding. There is an *"ex parte* wall" separating the Commissioners, the presiding Administrative Law Judge, and the Commissioners' policy and accounting advisors from all parties, including Staff. *RCW* 34.05.455.

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Nancy Glaser and Nancy Hirsh, Seattle, represent intervenor The Northwest Energy Coalition.

- 4 Contact information provided at the conference for the parties' representatives is attached as Appendix A to this order.
- 5 **PETITIONS FOR INTERVENTION.** The Energy Project and The Northwest Energy Coalition appeared at the conference and petitioned orally to intervene. No party objected to the interventions, which were granted. Each of the petitioners has established a substantial interest in this proceeding and we find that their participation will be in the public interest. These petitions to intervene are granted.
- 6 LATE-FILED PETITION TO INTERVENE. In addition, the Northwest Industrial Gas Users, or NWIGU, petitioned on September 8, 2006, for intervention. It failed to appear at the prehearing conference under a mistaken understanding that telephone conferencing would be available for the conference, which was held in Seattle. It attempted to communicate with the presiding officers during the prehearing conference, but was unable to reach them. NWIGU asks the Commission to accept its petition, filed two days after the conference.
- 7 We are including Mr. Finklea's contact information with that of parties. Any party who objects to NWIGU's petition for intervention may do so within ten days after the date of this order. Any objection must be served on all other parties, and answers may be submitted within five days following service of the objection.
- 8 The petition on its face shows an adequate interest in the proceeding, and the organization has participated in prior natural gas proceedings. There is no facially apparent prejudice to any party from the two-day delay in submission of the petition. In the absence of an objection showing cause for denial, NWIGU's petition will be deemed granted.
- 9 PROTECTIVE ORDER. The parties ask that the Commission enter a protective order in this docket under RCW 34.05.446, RCW 80.04.095, WAC 480-07-420 and WAC 80-07-423 to protect the confidentiality of proprietary information. The request was granted and a protective order will be entered in this docket.

- 10 **DISCOVERY.** The parties asked that the discovery rules be invoked in this docket, under WAC 480-07-400. The matter is one that qualifies for discovery, and the discovery rules WAC 480-07-400 – 425 are invoked.
- 11 PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE. The parties agreed upon the following procedural schedule during the conference. The Commission adopts this procedural schedule, which is set out below and is attached to this Order as Appendix B.<sup>2</sup>

- 12 NOTICE OF HEARING. The Commission will hold evidentiary hearings in this matter beginning December 4, 2006, at 9:30 a.m in the Commission's Hearing Room, Second Floor, Chandler Plaza Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S. W., Olympia, Washington.
- 13 NOTICE OF PREHEARING CONFERENCE: The Commission will convene a prehearing conference in this matter on November 30, 2006, at 9:30 a.m. in the Commission's Hearing Room, Second Floor, Chandler Plaza Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S. W., Olympia, Washington to mark exhibits, including exhibits on cross examination, if any, and to address any procedural matters that the parties may present. If no matters warrant attention, the conference will be cancelled.

- 14 DOCUMENT PREPARATION AND FILING REQUIREMENTS. Parties must file an original plus 8 copies of all pleadings, motions, briefs, and other prefiled materials. These materials must conform to the format and publication guidelines in WAC 480-07-395 and WAC 480-07-460. The Commission requires that materials be three-hole punched with *oversized* holes to allow easy handling. The Commission may require a party to refile any document that fails to conform to these standards.
- 15 All filings must be mailed or delivered to the Executive Secretary, Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission, P.O. Box 47250, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive, S.W. Olympia, Washington 98504-7250. Both the post office box and street address are required to expedite deliveries by the U.S. Postal Service.
- An electronic copy of all filings must be provided through the Commission's Web Portal (www.wutc.wa.gov/e-filing) or by e-mail delivery to <records@wutc.wa.gov>. Alternatively, parties may furnish an electronic copy by delivering with each filing a CD or a 3.5-inch IBM-formatted high-density diskette including the filed document(s). Parties should furnish electronic copies in .pdf (Adobe Acrobat) format, supplemented by a separate file in MS Word 6.0 (or later), or WordPerfect 5.1 (or later) format. Parties are required to follow WAC 480-07-140(5) in organizing and identifying electronic files.
- 17 ELECTRONIC SUBMISSION OF DOCUMENTS. Pursuant to WAC 480-07-145(6) the presiding officer may grant parties a one-day extension of the paper-filing requirement, allowing electronic submission of documents with the Commission on the filing deadline. Parties may only submit documents electronically with the Commission in this proceeding with the permission of the presiding officer. If, at any time during this proceeding, parties are authorized to submit documents with the Commission electronically under WAC 480-07-145(6), parties must submit the document through the Commission's Web portal (www.wutc.wa.gov/e-filing) or by email to records@wutc.wa.gov, and file an original, plus 8 copies, of the document with the Commission by the following business day. Finally to perfect filing, parties must provide courtesy copies of filings to the presiding officer and advisory staff, as well as the parties to the proceeding. PLEASE NOTE: The one-day extension of

the deadline for paper filing is NOT the rule of the case, and is not available in the absence of PRIOR authorization from the presiding officer. Parties should request permission at least 48 hours prior to the stated filing deadline.

- 18 ALTERNATE DISPUTE RESOLUTION. The Commission supports the informal settlement of matters before it. Parties are encouraged to consider means of resolving disputes informally. The Commission does have limited ability to provide dispute resolution services; if you wish to explore those services, please call the Director, Administrative Law Division, at 360-664-1142.
- 19 NOTICE TO PARTIES: Any objection to the provisions of this Order must be filed within ten (10) days after the service date of this Order, pursuant to WAC 480-07-430 and WAC 480-07-810. Absent such objection, this Order will control further proceedings in this matter, subject to Commission review. Parties must provide courtesy copies of filings to the presiding administrative law judge.
