

IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR PUGET SOUND ENERGY CUSTOMERS ABOUT PROPOSED CHANGES IN ELECTRIC LIGHTING RATES

Puget Sound Energy (PSE) on May 1, 2018, filed a request with the state Utilities and Transportation Commission (UTC) to adjust electric lighting rates. The requested change is proposed to be effective on June 1, 2018.

The request proposes to update the rate calculation for company-owned lights in base rate lighting schedules and Schedule 140, Property Tax Adjustment. This would be reflected in both the Electricity charge and Facilities charge on customer statements. If approved by the UTC, the request would have an overall average 0.1 percent increase for all electric lighting schedules. Some lighting schedule rates will increase while some will decrease. There is no change proposed to Schedule 7, Residential Service.

Flood Lighting (Schedules 58 & 59)	1.9 increase

The UTC has the authority to set final rates that may vary from PSE's request, either higher or lower or structured differently depending on the results of its review.
