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JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. So we are on the record. Good morning. My name is Laura Chartoff. I am an administrative law judge with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission.

Today is November 14th, 2018, and the time is 9:03 a.m. There are five charter party or excursion service carriers who should be here today. So the first thing we will do is see who's here. There is a court reporter who is recording everything we say, so when $I$ call your name, please raise your hand and also say "here" or "present." So the first is TE-180401, Seattle 7 Days Limo?

MR. JAGDIP SINGH: Present.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Present, thank you.
TE-180582, Leavenworth Party Bus?
MR. KELLY: Present.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Thank you.
TE-180710, Pack's Shuttle?
MR. PACK: Present.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Present on the bridge line.

TE-180805, Duane Coggins, doing business as Kokopelli's Run?

MR. COGGINS: Present.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Thank you.
MR. COGGINS: You're welcome.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: And TE-180826, Exotours?
Okay. I'm hearing nothing. That's the one where you said...

MR. TURCOTT: That's correct, Your Honor. They're on their way.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: They are on their way.
Okay. So I'll recall them in a -- later in the proceeding.

Okay. So you are here because the Commission has information that your company is operating or advertising as a charter party or excursion service carrier without a permit and has -- and the Commission has initiated this enforcement action against you.

So operating as a charter party or excursion carrier without a permit is illegal and subject to a penalty of up to $\$ 5,000$ per violation. If proven, the Commission can order you to stop operating and impose

1 the penalty.

So I'll explain the -- your choices at this proceeding. You can choose to agree to cease and desist providing, offering, or advertising unpermitted charter party or excursion services. If you choose this option, you will need to show what you have done to shut down your business either completely or partially. I'm going to want to see proof that you're no longer operating or advertising, for example, you will need to prove that you have taken down or changed your websites or other online advertisements for your business.

The other option is to ask for a classification hearing if you want to show why you don't need a permit. So if you choose a hearing, you are denying that you offer or advertise charter party or excursion services. And for this choice, we'll schedule a hearing sometime in the next two months with a deadline a week before the hearing for both you and Commission Staff to list your witnesses and file any exhibits. So I have some dates, available dates, for that hearing. It could be in late December or the first half of January.

So I will call you up one at a time in just a moment. Mike Turcott is seated to my right over here. He is a Commission compliance investigator supervisor,

1 and he will be speaking for Commission Staff. There's 2 another Staff member who will also be speaking, Jason 3 Hoxit.

1 date. And after I hear from each of you, you will -- we will take a break so you can meet with Staff and talk about your case and also discuss the penalty.

You were each served with a complaint that alleges you were providing the services without a permit and asks the Commission to penalize you. The law sets the maximum penalty for each violation at $\$ 5,000$. Staff will recommend a penalty and you will have a chance to reach an agreement with Staff about the penalty amount. Staff will explain the recommendation, but the Commission can make the final decision on the penalty amount.

Okay. So, Mr. Turcott, I'll -- will you be the representative -- will you be representing Staff for Seattle 7 Day Limo?

MR. TURCOTT: No, Your Honor. That will be Mr. Hoxit.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Oh, okay. Why don't I have both of you come forward and I'll swear you both in. (Mike Turcott and Jason Hoxit sworn.)

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. So I'm going to call TE-180401, Seattle 7 Days Limo. Please come forward, and if you'll take a seat at the table. Make sure your microphone is turned on. You should see a red light.

So please state your first and last name,
spelling your last name for the court reporter.
MR. JAGDIP SINGH: Yeah, it's Jagdip,
J-a-g-d-i-p.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Can you speak into the microphone?

MR. JAGDIP SINGH: It's Jagdip Singh, J-a-g-d-i-p, $S-i-n-g-h$ is my last name.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: And are you here with the company too?

MR. AMANDEEP SINGH: Yeah, I'm one of -- I'm one of their friends.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay.
MR. AMANDEEP SINGH: So should I give my name?

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Oh, so --
MR. JAGDIP SINGH: He's my friend. He just works with the tech.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Oh, okay. So he's not here representing the company?

MR. JAGDIP SINGH: No.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay.
MR. JAGDIP SINGH: He's just going to, you know, explain the -- he's a tech guy, so he's -- he's an engineer, you know, website and all that stuff he does, so I just brought him to help me out.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Is he going to be
testifying or --
MR. JAGDIP SINGH: Yes.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: -- is he just -- oh, okay.
So give me your name, please.
MR. AMANDEEP SINGH: Amandeep, A-m-a-n-d, double $e, ~ p$, and last name is Singh, $S-i-n-g-h$.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: And what is your position with the company?

MR. JAGDIP SINGH: It's the owner.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Owner, okay.
So can you both please stand and raise your right hand?
(Jagdip Singh and Amandeep Singh sworn.)
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Thank you.
Okay. So I heard that you have a concern about service?

MR. JAGDIP SINGH: Yes.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Can you tell me about that?
MR. JAGDIP SINGH: First, I didn't get
served the right way. There is no such driver called John or whatnot, that worked for me. And then when it got served, you know, my -- my drivers are not responsible for taking any or accepting any legal documents. If anything, they have to serve to the

1 office or they gotta find the right person to serve. So
2 I didn't get notified anything. So what I got last --
3 last week, I just got an email from Jason for all the 4 information. case?

MR. HOXIT: Yeah, on that specific date, it was served in the hands of a John Doe, so it was an unidentified individual who was representing Seattle 7 Days Limo. Staff had booked a ride under a fictitious identity to meet at a hotel, and that was the individual who came to pick out -- pick up the individual.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Did Staff or the process

1 server attempt to serve them any other way?

MR. HOXIT: Yes, there was a total of 15 attempts. The first looks like five were at an address on 80th Avenue West in Edmonds, which were unsuccessful. JUDGE CHARTOFF: Hold on. My pen ran out of ink.

MR. HOXIT: Okay.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. So there were a total of 15 attempts?

MR. HOXIT: Yes, and that includes the final one at the hotel. So the first five were at the 80th Avenue West address, which were -- was the address registered on Mr. Singh's driver's license. Those were unsuccessful, so then we found an address of 13015 Beverly Park Road in Lynnwood, Washington, and that is where we attempted an additional I believe it was nine services.

And on multiple attempts, there were people present in vehicles registered to the company at that address, and the Hummer H 2 s that were on the website were located at the address identified in the declaration, but nobody was willing to accept service or identify themselves. And there were signs for Seattle 7 Days Limo at that address.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Is -- is the 13015 address

1 in Lynnwood, is that your office address?

MR. JAGDIP SINGH: I own it, so I rent it to somebody.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: What is your address?
MR. JAGDIP SINGH: 228 -- 22826 - 80th
Avenue West, Edmonds, Washington 98026.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: So I -- I can't make a ruling right now on whether service was -- was good or not. I'd have to take that under advisement.

MR. JAGDIP SINGH: Yeah.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: What $I$ can say is that you are here and maybe you should take this opportunity to either -- to choose one of the options, because even if service was bad, Staff is going to serve you again. MR. JAGDIP SINGH: Yeah, no, I understand that. But what if $I$ never find out then, you know, I never show up to the court, what's going to happen, you know? That's going to reflect me, though, in a bad way. Because actually, you know, I'm not talking just about only me. What if it happens to some other companies and they have to go through the same process if they don't

1 find out? Then they're going to have to deal with the 2 other penalties, you know.

I think you said, you know, served this better or make this better, I guess the next time it won't just happen like that, I guess. Because the drivers are only responsible for just to take the customer, pick them up, take them to, you know, do their jobs. They're not actually there to get served any kind of legal paper or legal arguments, you know. That's not their responsibilities.

You know, if they have to serve, they have to serve the owners, manager, or, you know, whatever they have to do to serve the right people so the other people don't have to, you know -- I just find out, that's why I'm here. Otherwise, he should be putting another penalty on the top, you know, if I never showed up.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: I -- I understand, but at this point, you know, you are here, you got the materials. Are you prepared to, you know, make a decision on which way to go?

MR. JAGDIP SINGH: I'm somewhat, you know, prepared, you know. I can always make decisions, you know, but I can provide you what I have, though, if you approve it and whatnot, you know, what they have.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: So are you willing to admit that you were operating without a permit?

MR. JAGDIP SINGH: No, actually, Your Honor, I'm not.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: You're not, okay. MR. JAGDIP SINGH: Yes.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: So would you like to set a hearing?

MR. JAGDIP SINGH: Yeah, that would be nice, but, you know, if I want to hear -- if you want to hear, I can explain too right now or you can set another date.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: If you're denying that
you're operating without a permit, is it because you think that your business doesn't require it?

MR. JAGDIP SINGH: Yes, ma'am.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay.
MR. JAGDIP SINGH: I used to run a UTC
license. I have the proofs to 2015 and '16. I think they have the proofs too, but after that one, it says it expired and I never run it. I only have two vehicles that's listed on the business, which is a Hummer and the ten-pack, you know. And I do have the paperwork from the City too and the insurances, but these are -- I also have the old UTC inspections and the insurances that I used to run.

So five million [sic] or whatnot, I have all the paperwork and I have a licensed vehicle, which is the Hummer that they actually talking about and then they -- the insurances for both and they're legal to doing a limousine carrier, which is I'm actually holding it right now. This is what $I$ was doing the whole time once it got -- the UTC got expired so -- so I don't know what concerns and what pictures or what they -- if they can explain me more, I can explain them more.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. So yeah, we're not prepared to do a classification hearing today. Staff would need --

I assume Staff would prefer us to set this out for a hearing?

MR. TURCOTT: Yes, Your Honor. We would ask that a classification hearing be set, and if possible, since it's difficult to serve this company, if any way possible for them to leave today with the date of that hearing. It seems to be difficult through normal channels to serve process on this company.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Yeah, yes.
So do you have your calendar with you?
MR. JAGDIP SINGH: Let me check.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: I have some days that I -so in December, I have the 20 th or the 21 st, and then in

1 January, I have a number of dates in the first half.
2 The 3rd, 4th.

MR. TURCOTT: Yes, Your Honor.
MR. HOXIT: Yes, that day will work for Staff.

MR. JAGDIP SINGH: Let me confirm one more time. Yeah, that works. Thank you.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. And how can we -- so we're going to send the notice to the address --

MR. JAGDIP SINGH: 22826, yeah.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: 22826.
MR. JAGDIP SINGH: 80th Avenue West,
Edmonds, Washington 98026. If you are sending them, please send a certified mail. That way you can leave the note at the door, because every time we got served, there was no message or nothing was actually left on the door. And my mom don't speak English, so she don't know, you know, what to accept and what not. And I'm working on pretty much every time whenever they try to come there.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. All right. Okay.

1 So you're free to go.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Oh, it's typically 9:30. MR. JAGDIP SINGH: It's 9:30, okay. JUDGE CHARTOFF: Does that work? MR. JAGDIP SINGH: Yeah, that works, we're just gonna hit the traffic, two hours.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: I might be able to do the afternoon if that would...

MR. JAGDIP SINGH: Yeah, that works great, then.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: We'll do 1:00 p.m. MR. JAGDIP SINGH: Yes, ma'am, thank you. JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. All right. You're free to go.

MR. JAGDIP SINGH: All right. Thank you very much.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. So I'm going to call TE-180582, Leavenworth Party Bus. MR. KELLY: Is this on? How about that. All right.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: So please state your first and last name.

MR. KELLY: Christopher Kelly.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Can you spell your last
name?
MR. KELLY: K-e-l-l-y.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Thank you.
And what is your position with the company?
MR. KELLY: I'm the owner/operator.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. I have to swear you in.

MR. KELLY: Okay.
(Christopher Kelly sworn.)
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Thank you.
Okay. So do you understand the choices that
I explained earlier?
MR. KELLY: I do.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: And how do you --
MR. KELLY: I made steps to close down. I went on and I took off all my online presence, and I just plan to reopen in May of 2019 once I get all of these compliancy issues ironed out.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Does Staff have a recommendation on this?

MR. TURCOTT: Yes, Your Honor. We spoke briefly, Mr. Kelly and I spoke briefly before the hearing, and I think we'll be able to reach a settlement

1 in this matter.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Great.
Okay. So when we take a break, you can talk to Staff and see if you can come to an agreed order. That order will say that you were operating without a permit, that you advertised without a permit, and that you agree to stop operating until you get a permit if you do decide to apply for one. And once you feel comfortable that you understand the order, you and Staff will both sign it. It will also include most likely an agreement on the penalty amount, but if not, you can explain to me why the penalty should be different than what Staff is recommending. And do you have any questions?

MR. KELLY: That's it. Fair enough. JUDGE CHARTOFF: Oh, okay. Please return to your seat and wait for the break. Thank you.

Okay. TE-180710, Pack's Shuttle? MR. PACK: I'm here, Your Honor. JUDGE CHARTOFF: Oh, okay. On the bridge line. Please state your first and last name, spelling your last name for the court reporter. MR. PACK: Nathan Pack, $P-a-c-k$. JUDGE CHARTOFF: And what is your position with the company?

MR. PACK: Member/manager.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. I will swear you in. (Nathan Pack sworn.)

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Thank you.
Okay. So do you understand the choices that
I explained earlier?
MR. PACK: I do. Mr. Hoxit and I have come to an agreement. I've signed it.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. So you guys have one signed already?

MR. HOXIT: Yeah, yeah. Pack's Shuttle has provided evidence that it's closed its business accounts, sold its vehicles, and moved the registration over to the new buyer and also disposed of the signage that they had been advertising with in Moses Lake. And Mr. Pack and I have come to a settlement agreement that we would like to propose to you during the recess.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Okay. So I will
review that at the recess.
Mr. Pack, you will have to stay on the line for a while and we'll call you back after the recess. Do you have any questions?

MR. PACK: I would just like to go on the record saying I have done everything I could to get everything to Jason and the State's pleasure. If there

1 are any signs left somehow -- I had sold this company 2 and they were operating it without a license. It was my 3 fault for not transferring and closing it on my side, but I would like the record to note that I've made every attempt to collect every single sign there might have been. So if there is a sign floating around there somewhere, $I$ didn't know about it and I'm not using it. JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Okay. Anything further from Staff?

MR. HOXIT: Would it be okay with you, Judge, if we call Mr. Pack back before we reconvene from recess? That way he's not on the line for however long. JUDGE CHARTOFF: Sure. What are you -- you mean --

MR. HOXIT: Staff would call him when we're ready to come back into the hearing and would ask that, on the record, Mr. Pack provide a valid phone number for Staff to contact him with so he doesn't have to stay on hold during the entire recess, and we can call him and then he would call back into the bridge line.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Oh, sure. So you want me to ask him to -MR. HOXIT: Yeah. JUDGE CHARTOFF: -- provide a phone number? Can you provide a phone number for us to

1 reach you?

MR. PACK: Yes, of course. I would love to do that.

Thank you, Jason, for that offer.
I can be reached two different ways. The first and primary way would be 509-750-2488, and the second being 509-762-1234.

I'm also available by email as well, Jason.
MR. HOXIT: Thank you.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. All right. So let's see where we are now. Okay. So I'm going to call TE-180805, Duane Coggins, doing business as --

MR. PACK: Should I get off the phone now?
JUDGE CHARTOFF: So you're saying you will -- he can hang up and you will call him back?

MR. HOXIT: Yes. Yeah, I will call Mr. Pack back when we reconvene.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Oh, okay. So you can hang up.

MR. PACK: Thank you, Your Honor.
Thank you, Jason.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Duane Coggins, doing business as Kokopelli's Run?

Please state your first and last name, spelling your last name for the court reporter.

MR. COGGINS: Duane Coggins, $\mathrm{C}-\mathrm{o}-\mathrm{g}-\mathrm{g}-\mathrm{i}-\mathrm{n}-\mathrm{s}$. JUDGE CHARTOFF: And what is your position with the company?

MR. COGGINS: Owner/operator.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. I will swear you in.
(Duane Coggins sworn.)
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Thank you.
So do you understand the choices I explained
earlier?
MR. COGGINS: Yes, I do. I'm going to go with the cease operating until $I$ can get a permit again. JUDGE CHARTOFF: So you agree to cease and desist until such time is -- when you're able to get -MR. COGGINS: Yeah, it'd be March when I'm able to get up and running again.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Does Staff have anything to say on this one?

MR. TURCOTT: Yes, Your Honor. Mr. Coggins and I discussed the matter before the hearing. He's taken his advertising down, we've discussed plans for reapplying in the spring, and we've discussed potential penalty agreements and we're ready to proceed with that. JUDGE CHARTOFF: Great.

Okay. So yeah, when we take a break, you will discuss with Staff.

MR. COGGINS: Okay.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: And I won't go through the whole -- you heard what I said to the previous company. MR. COGGINS: Right.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay.
MR. COGGINS: Okay. Thank you.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: So please take a seat.
Okay. And the last is TE-180826, Exotours?
Please come forward.
MR. LUCA: Morning. I will take this one, I guess.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Please state your first and last name.

MR. LUCA: Benjamin Luca, L-u-c-a, and I am owner/operator.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Do you understand the choices that I explained earlier?

MR. LUCA: I wasn't in here, but I believe it was the cease and desist order, apply for a hearing. I'm not quite sure how it would be because I have ceased and desist, but I already have the permit now, I believe.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Oh, okay. So did -MR. LUCA: Our situation is a little different, I guess.

MR. HOXIT: Yeah, it's my understanding that the company has applied and they are awaiting a motor carrier inspection prior to being potentially issued a certificate.

MR. LUCA: Which I do now have the inspection and everything that we had passed.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. So what we would be asking you to cease and desist to stop operating until such time as you get the permit.

MR. LUCA: Okay.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: So -- okay. So when we take a break, you can talk with Staff and see if you can sign an agreed order. That order will say that you agree you were operating without a permit and that you advertised without a permit and that you agree to stop operating until you get a permit. And then once you feel comfortable that you understand the order, you and Staff will both sign it, and it will most likely include an agreement on the penalty amount. But if not, you can explain why the penalty should be different than what Staff is recommending. So do you have any questions?

MR. LUCA: I don't think so, no.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Oh, okay. So please return to your seat.

MR. LUCA: Awesome. Thank you.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: So at this point, we're going to take a break, and as soon as I -- you have a chance to review the cease and desist orders with Staff, you can talk about the penalty. The recommended penalty may be small or there may be a reason why Staff asked for a larger penalty, for example, if you've been in front of a judge here before or you had a permit with the Commission that was cancelled.

So usually part of the penalty is suspended and you will not have to pay it unless you break the law again. So you'll pay the unsuspended part of the penalty today and you'd only have to pay the rest if you violate the order. And then I'll call everyone back up and make sure you understand the order and you can sign it and leave with a copy of it. So anything else before we take a break? Okay. We are in recess.
(Recess taken from 9:36 a.m. until
10:23 a.m.)

JUDGE CHARTOFF: We are back on the record at 10:25 a.m. I understand the cease and desist orders have been explained to each company. So I will call you back up one at a time in the order we went before except we'll call Pack's last. Is that...

MR. HOXIT: Yeah, that's correct.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Okay. So I'm going

1 to call Leavenworth Party Bus. Please come forward, 2 take a seat.

Okay. So, Mr. Kelly, did you have a chance to read the whole order?

MR. KELLY: I did. I did. Mike went over it with me.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: And do you understand it?
MR. KELLY: I do. There was -- the only one stipulation that I did want to state to the Court was the fact that I believe it was paragraph 10 or 12, the bottom line was that $I$ was not aware that $I$ was operating out of compliance. The letter that was sent to the company was sent to the former owner, and I was never made aware of that. I wasn't -- I wasn't aware that I was out of compliance until the -- I was served with the papers. So Mike was very understanding and I will take whatever penalty that the Court deems fit. It was just -- it wasn't something I was trying to get over on anybody. I wasn't trying to pull anything off. I was just unaware that $I$ was out of compliance.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. MR. TURCOTT: Your Honor, in -- on this point, the -- the violation is for operating after cancellation of a certificate, but $I$ wanted to point out that the certificate was issued to a previous owner.

1 And so while it's true that Leavenworth Party Bus
2 operated after cancellation of a certificate, Mr. Kelly did not operate. You know, this was -- he was a new owner. He did not receive the cancellation letter the previous owner received, and that's reflected in the recommendation for suspended -- we recommended suspending a larger penalty amount in this case to be fair to the circumstances.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Yeah, it looks like they're suspending -- let's see here. So there's a \$10,000 penalty and Staff is recommending a 9,000 be -- portion be suspended and that seems in line with --

MR. KELLY: Okay. I made the payment already so...

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Oh, okay.
MR. KELLY: That ship has kind of sailed. JUDGE CHARTOFF: So for the record, you are agreeing to shut down until you -- unless or until you get a permit.

MR. KELLY: Absolutely.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: The payment -- okay. So you already made the payment.

MR. KELLY: I did.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: So -- okay. So I have a couple of things to tell you. Okay. So the -- the

1 \$9,000 is suspended for two years from today's date, 2 which is November 14th, 2018. That means that if Staff

3 finds an advertisement or you offer charter party or 4 excursion carrier services during this time, you will 5 have to pay that $\$ 9,000$ penalty.

MR. KELLY: I understand.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: And the order to cease and desist is permanent. It never expires, that is unless you get a permit.

MR. KELLY: Got it.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: So if Staff discovers you're still operating even after two years, Staff can go straight to superior court and ask for higher penalties.

MR. KELLY: Understood.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Do you have any
additional questions about the order?
MR. KELLY: No.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Anything from Staff?
MR. TURCOTT: No, ma'am.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: No, okay.
So I'm going to sign it and -- okay. Staff
will make you a copy and when you receive it, you're free to go.

MR. KELLY: Thank you.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. So next I'm going to call Duane Coggins, doing business as Kokopelli's Run. So, Mr. Coggins, did you have a chance to read the whole order?

MR. COGGINS: Yes, I did.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: And do you understand it?
MR. COGGINS: I do.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: I see that you both signed it.

MR. COGGINS: Yes.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: You and Staff. Looks like there's two violations in this case, one for offering to -- to -- offer to conduct operations after the cancellation of a certificate.

MR. COGGINS: Yes.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: And advertised.
MR. COGGINS: Yes, ma'am.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: And the penalty is $\$ 10,000$, a $\$ 7,500$ portion of the penalty is suspended for two years.

MR. COGGINS: Yes.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: And from today's date, and I'll repeat it, but I -- I know you've heard it already, that means if Staff finds an advertisement or you offer charter party or excursion carrier services during this
time, you will have to pay the full penalty.
MR. COGGINS: Right, okay.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: And the order to cease and
desist is permanent. That means that even after two years, if you -- if they find you operating without a permit, they can go straight to superior court and ask for much higher penalties.

MR. COGGINS: Right.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. And you -- I see you have a payment schedule.

MR. COGGINS: Yes, and I made today's payment already.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. And you made today's payment. And the payment schedule is about -- is $\$ 250$ due each month on the 14 th or the 15 th if the 14 th is a Sunday, I assume. And do you understand that if you miss a payment, you'll have to pay the full amount?

MR. COGGINS: Yes, I do.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: So including the suspended penalty. So if for some reason you're going to be late making a payment, you must contact Staff and make arrangements so you don't end up having to pay the whole penalty.

MR. COGGINS: Okay.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Do you understand what you

1 can and can't do?

MR. COGGINS: Yes, I do.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. And remember,
Commission Staff is always available if you have any questions. Okay. I will sign the order. Okay. When you get a copy of it, you'll be free to go.

MR. COGGINS: Okay. Thank you.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. I'm going to call
Exotours.
Okay. Mr. Luca, did you have a chance to read the whole order?

MR. LUCA: Yes, ma'am.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Do you have any questions?
MR. LUCA: Not at all.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. And it looks like there are two violations, one, offer to conduct operations without the required certificate and on one occasion advertised to conduct operations without the required certificate. You are agreeing to shut down until your permit is --

MR. LUCA: Arrives.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: -- in place.
MR. LUCA: Absolutely.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. The penalty is
$\$ 10,000$, a $\$ 9,500$ portion of the penalty is suspended

1 for two years. And you understand that if Staff finds 2 you operating, the entire amount will be due?

MR. LUCA: Mm-hmm.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. And the payment schedule -- you made $\$ 125$ payment. MR. LUCA: I'll make it tomorrow. I -- we recently lost our wallet so...

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. MR. LUCA: It will come in tomorrow. JUDGE CHARTOFF: You plan to make it tomorrow.

MR. LUCA: Yeah.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: And \$125,000 -- \$125, \$125
will be owed on --
MR. LUCA: 15th and 14th.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: December 14th, January
15th, and February 15th. Okay. And also, if you miss a payment, the whole thing will be due so --

MR. LUCA: Don't miss it for 125 bucks.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: And if anything -- if you have any problems, please contact Staff and make

1 arrangements. Okay. Are there any questions?

MR. LUCA: No, ma'am.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. So I will sign this.
MR. LUCA: Thank you.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. When you get a copy, you're free to go.

And then is -- is Pack's on the line or do we need to call them?

MR. HOXIT: They should be on the line. I called them during the break.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Is Pack's
Delivery, are you on the bridge line? Mr. Pack?
I wonder if we can try to -- why don't we take a short recess and we'll try to get him back on there.

MR. HOXIT: Yeah, I will contact him.
(Recess taken from 10:34 a.m. until
10:38 a.m.)
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. So let's be back on the record. It is 10:40 a.m.

So, Mr. Pack?
MR. PACK: Yes, I'm here.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: You're on the line, okay.
Did you have a chance to read the whole order?
MR. PACK: I did.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: And do you have any
questions about it?
MR. PACK: I do not.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. And I'll just go through it here. It looks like there's two violations, one for offering charter party or excursion services and one for advertising those services. And there is a $\$ 10,000$ penalty, 9,000 of the penalty is suspended for a period of two years from today's date, which is November 14th, 2018. That means that if Staff finds an advertisement or you offer charter party or excursion carrier services during that time, you will have to pay the full $\$ 10,000$ penalty; do you understand that?

MR. PACK: I do.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. And also, the order to cease and desist is permanent. It never expires. So if Staff discovers you are still operating even after two years, they can go straight to superior court and ask for much higher penalties. So it's important --

MR. PACK: I understand.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. And it looks like -let me see if there's a -- there's a payment plan, $\$ 250$ will be paid today.

MR. PACK: Yes.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: And $\$ 250$ will be due

1 December 14th, January 14th, and February 14th. And do
2 you understand that if you miss a payment, you'll have
3 to pay the entire amount including the suspended
4 penalty?

MR. PACK: Yes, I believe I'm able to set up a payment -- I mean an automatic payment.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Okay. And if for some reason you have any problems, you're going to be late making a payment, you must contact Staff and make arrangements so you don't end up having to pay the whole penalty.

MR. PACK: Okay. I will do that.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: And legally, you understand what you can and can't do?

MR. PACK: I -- yes, I do.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. And remember that Commission Staff is always available to assist you if you have any questions. So are there any additional -any questions about the order?

MR. PACK: I do -- I have one -- have one thing made clear to me. If -- so I sold this business, if they continue -- or if they do not make a payment, I'm going to repossess the van and -- and everything else that was sold to them. If I decided in the future, is it possible for me to reapply for a UTC license with

1 all the proper insurance and license and documentation?

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Yes, this -- this order does not prevent you from getting permitted.

MR. PACK: Okay.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Our goal would be that either people, you know, don't operate or get a permit and do operate.

MR. PACK: Okay.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: So yes, this only prevents you -- or orders you to not operate so long as you don't have a permit.

MR. PACK: Okay. Great.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. So I'm going to go ahead and sign this, and how will it be -- how will Staff get a copy of this to Mr. Pack?

MR. HOXIT: We have a physical address on file, but if it's okay with Mr. Pack to serve him electronically.

MR. PACK: Yeah, no, that's fine. Email is great.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Okay. So he will do that probably by the end of the day.

MR. HOXIT: Yes.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. So that's it, then. We are in recess. You're free to go.
