#### CENTURYLINK QC'S MOTION FOR CLARIFICATION AND RECONSIDERATION

#### **INTRODUCTION**

On September 6, 2011, the Commission issued an order<sup>1</sup> in this matter requiring that Qwest Corporation d/b/a CenturyLink QC ("CenturyLink QC"), among other things, (1) stop its planned implementation of Maintenance Tracking Gateway ("MTG") interface; (2) work with CLECs in developing MTG or other alternatives; and (3) comply with all substantive and procedural provisions of the Integra and Joint CLEC Settlement Agreements as outlined in the Commission's March 31, 2011 Order. In the intervening time period, hearing officers

Absent modification by the Commission or courts, CenturyLink QC intends to fully comply with these requirements. In order to do so, and particularly in light of the existing orders upholding CenturyLink's right to proceed with development and implementation of MTG in Colorado and Washington during contested case proceedings, some interpretation questions have arisen regarding these requirements. In order to make sure there is no doubt regarding the Commission's intent, these comments detail how CenturyLink QC interprets these requirements and asks the Commission to clarify or reconsider its Order to the extent that something else is intended.

### A. Geographic Scope of the Order.

The Order does not explicitly address geographic scope. While MTG is a region-wide system and would be designed to serve customers in 14 states, it is possible to adjust MTG so that it refuses to accept orders from Minnesota. CenturyLink QC understands that the Order addresses Minnesota alone and not systems implementation in other states. This interpretation appears consistent with a statement made by Commissioner Boyd during deliberations: ". . . If this is a tool they want to implement systemwide and they are prohibited from doing so in the state of Minnesota, I don't know what it means to any other state they're working on. . . ."<sup>5</sup>

No other Commissioner appeared to comment on the question of geographic scope.

Interpreting the Order as addressing Minnesota alone eliminates jurisdictional issues with the Commission's Order and shows respect for the authority of the commissions in Washington and Colorado to resolve this dispute as it applies in those states. Any other interpretation would go beyond the authority of this Commission.
