- NATURE OF PROCEEDING. On February 27, 2017, Whatcom County filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) a Petition for installation of median barriers at a highway-rail grade crossing located at Yacht Club Road, USDOT Crossing No. 084796F (Petition).
- On February 28, 2017, the Commission sent a letter to BNSF Railway Company (BNSF) requesting a response to the Petition within twenty days indicating its support or opposition.
- On March 10, 2017, BNSF filed with the Commission a notice of opposition and requested that the matter be scheduled for hearing.
- 4 **CONFERENCE.** The Commission convened a prehearing conference in this docket at Olympia, Washington, on April 24, 2017, before Administrative Law Judge Rayne Pearson.
- APPEARANCES. Daniel Gibson, Chief Civil Deputy Prosecuting Attorney, Bellingham, Washington, represents Whatcom County. Jennifer L. Willingham, General Attorney, Fort Worth, Texas, represents BNSF. Brett P. Shearer, Assistant Attorney General, Olympia, Washington, represents Commission Staff. <sup>1</sup> Contact information for the parties' representatives is attached as Appendix A to this order.

- AMENDED PETITION. The parties agree that the procedural schedule should be held in abeyance pending Whatcom County's decision to file an amended petition, which may resolve the underlying dispute in this proceeding. The parties agree that Whatcom County should file any such amended petition by May 4, 2017.
- PETITIONS FOR INTERVENTION. No party sought to intervene at this stage in the proceeding. In the event the parties are unable to resolve the underlying dispute, the Commission will entertain petitions for intervention at the second prehearing conference.
- 8 **DISCOVERY.** The Commission holds its determination on the availability of the Commission's discovery rules in abeyance until the second prehearing conference.
- NOTICE OF PREHEARING CONFERENCE. The Commission will hold a second prehearing conference in this matter on Wednesday, May 17, 2017, at 2 p.m. in Room 139, First Floor, Richard Hemstad Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive SW, Olympia, Washington.
- ALTERNATE DISPUTE RESOLUTION. The Commission supports the informal settlement of matters before it. Parties are encouraged to consider means of resolving disputes informally. Absent such objection, this Order will control further proceedings in this matter, subject to Commission review.
