ORDER DISMISSING COMPLAINT AND ORDER SUSPENDING TARIFF REVISIONS; ALLOWING REVISED RATES TO BECOME EFFECTIVE

BACKGROUND

- On July 2, 2018, Washington Water Service Company (Washington Water or Company) filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) revisions to its currently effective Tariff WN U-2, designated as Sheet No. 1, Sheet No. 20, Sheet No. 22 29, and Sheet No. 31. The proposed revisions would generate approximately \$1,600,000 (13.8 percent) in additional annual revenue.
- 2 On July 26, 2018, the Commission entered Order 01, Complaint and Order Suspending Tariff Revisions (Order 01) pending an investigation to determine whether the revisions are fair, just, reasonable, and sufficient.
- ³ Commission staff (Staff) has completed its review of the Company's supporting financial documents, books, and records. Based on Staff's review, Staff and the Company agree that an increase of \$1,143,000 (9.6 percent) will result in rates that are fair, just, reasonable, and sufficient. On November 1, 2018, the Company filed revised rates and charges reflecting the adjusted revenue requirement. Staff recommends the Commission allow the revised rates and tariff revision filed by Washington Water November 1, 2018, to become effective on December 1, 2018.

DISCUSSION

4 We agree with Staff's recommendation and dismiss Order 01 to allow Washington Water's revised rates, as filed on November 1, 2018, to go into effect by operation of law on December 1, 2018.

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS

- 5 (1) The Commission is an agency of the State of Washington vested by statute with the authority to regulate the rates, rules, regulations, practices, accounts, securities, transfers of property and affiliated interests of public service companies, including water companies.
- 6 (2) Washington Water is a water company and a public service company subject to Commission jurisdiction.
- 7 (3) This matter came before the Commission at its regularly scheduled meeting on November 30, 2018.
- 8 (4) The tariff revisions presently under consideration are fair, just, reasonable, and sufficient because the Company has demonstrated the need for additional annual revenue.
- 9 (5) After reviewing the tariff revisions Washington Water filed in Docket UW-180592 and giving due consideration, the Commission finds it is consistent with the public interest to dismiss the Complaint and Order Suspending Tariff Revisions in Docket UW-180592, dated July 26, 2018, and allow the tariff revisions to Tariff WN U-2 filed November 1, 2018, to become effective on December 1, 2018.

ORDER

THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

- 10 (1) The Complaint and Order Suspending Tariff Revisions in Docket UW-180592, entered on July 26, 2018, is dismissed.
- 11 (2) The tariff revisions filed in this docket on November 1, 2018, by Washington Water Service Company shall become effective on December 1, 2018.
