RE: *In the Matter of the Penalty Assessment Against Job4Movers, LLC in the Amount of \$6,850,*
Dockets TV-220016 and TV-220017 (Consolidated)

TO ALL PARTIES:

On February 14, 2022, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) entered Order 01 (Order) in Dockets TV-220016 and TV-220017 (Consolidated). The Order approved Job4Movers, LLC's (Job4Movers or Company) safety management plan; upgraded the Company's safety rating to conditional and extended the provisional household goods period. The Order further assessed a \$6,850 penalty against Job4Movers and suspended a \$3,500 portion of the assessed penalty for a period of two years, and then waived, subject to the following conditions: a) Job4Movers must maintain a conditional safety rating; b) Commission staff (Staff) must conduct a follow-up investigation at least six months from the date of the Order; c) The Company may not incur any repeat critical violations upon re-inspection; and d) Job4Movers pays the \$3,350 portion of the penalty that is not suspended.

On June 22, 2022, the Company paid the \$3,350 portion of the penalty that was not suspended.

On February 8, 2023, Staff completed the required follow-up investigation, which resulted in a satisfactory safety rating. Job4Movers did not receive any repeat acute or critical violations of WAC 480-15.

The Commission finds that Job4Movers, LLC has complied with the conditions of Order 01. The \$3,500 portion of the penalty that was suspended is now waived, and this docket is closed.
