Dear Mr. Johnson,

Avista Corporation, dba Avista Utilities (Avista or the Company), submits the following comments in accordance with the Notice of Opportunity to Respond in the Matter of the Petition of City of Spokane for an Order Declaring that the City of Spokane Waste to Energy Facility is not "Baseload Electric Generation" Under RCW 80.80.010(4) and WAC 480-100-405(2)(a).

In its Notice dated April 20, 2021, the Commission gave notice that Interested Parties could provide feedback on the City's Petition. Avista, for its part, does not take a position as to whether the Waste to Energy Facility is or is not baseload electric generation. That legal finding is left to the Commission. That said, should the Commission decide to rule on the issue and find in favor of the City's position, we would engage with the City in negotiations on a long-term PPA. The Waste to Energy Facility has been an important resource for serving our customers, including the City of Spokane.
