Dear Mr. Hood:

This letter is in response to your request for a determination on the requirements for environmental review and critical areas review to close Barnhart Road at the BNSF railroad tracks and construct a gravel hammerhead. Based on the information submitted, including location of proposed work and estimated volume of fill material needed, it has been determined that your proposal does not require Critical Areas review. Barnhart Road is not a highway; therefore a Washington State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) review is not required under WAC197-11-865(2). The proposal also falls below SEPA categorical exemption flexible thresholds listed in WAC 197-11-800(1) and adopted by Yakima County under Yakima County Code Title 16.04.100.






