- 2 JUDGE RENDAHL: We are back on the record
- 3 after an extended morning break, and we now have a
- 4 change of court reporters, so essentially, this is a
- 5 new transcript. This is the continuation of the May
- 6 8th prehearing conference in Docket Nos. UT-003022 and
- 7 003040, which is Qwest's SGAT 271 proceeding, and I'm
- 8 Ann Rendahl, the administrative law judge presiding
- 9 over the prehearing conference.
- 10 Earlier this morning, we did a more extensive
- 11 appearances, and some of the parties who were here are
- 12 no longer here, but for this transcript, let's take
- 13 appearances and allow the court reporter to know who is
- 14 talking and who is on the bridge. In the hearing room,
- 15 I'll note that there is no attorney for Qwest, but
- 16 Elizabeth Weber is here, paralegal for Qwest, helping
- 17 us mark exhibits. Here in the hearing room, public
- 18 counsel?
- 19 MR. CROMWELL: Robert Cromwell for public
- 20 counsel.
- JUDGE RENDAHL: And on the bridge line
- 22 starting with Qwest?
- MR. FRANKEL: Jonathan Frankel for Qwest.
- JUDGE RENDAHL: AT&T?
- MS. DECOOK: Rebecca DeCook for AT&T.

- 1 MR. KOPTA: Gregory Kopta of the law firm
- 2 Davis, Wright, Tremaine, LLP, on behalf of AT&T.
- 3 JUDGE RENDAHL: Is there anyone else on the
- 4 bridge line? Janet Brown for AT&T, and they have a
- 5 speaker phone that is interacting with our equipment,
- 6 but I think I will be doing most of the talking from
- 7 here on out.
- 8 While we were off the record, we discussed
- 9 scheduling of witnesses and the hearing that's going to
- 10 begin Monday, May 13th, and cross-examination times, so
- 11 I'm going to repeat what I have from the parties, and
- 12 if you have any questions about this, please let me
- 13 know.
- On Monday, the 13th, we will start at ten
- 15 o'clock, and we will begin with the compliance issue of
- 16 the LCI/QCC issue. Qwest and AT&T will each have 10
- 17 minutes to address that, allowing 10 minutes for
- 18 questions from the Bench, and on the Section 272, sub
- 19 E, sub I, again, Qwest and AT&T will each have 10
- 20 minutes to address that with 10 minutes from the Bench.
- 21 At approximately 11:15 after the morning
- 22 break, we will begin with opening statements on the
- 23 public interest issues beginning with Public Counsel,
- 24 then AT&T and then Qwest, each for 15 minutes. We'll
- 25 likely then take our lunch break and come back at 1:30

- 1 and begin with the testimony and cross-examination of
- 2 Ms. Roth, and I have allotted 15 to 20 minutes of an
- 3 initial statement by Ms. Roth, and then Qwest has
- 4 indicated an hour of cross-examination.
- 5 At approximately 3:30, 3:45, after the
- 6 afternoon break, we will begin with Mr. Teitzel for
- 7 Qwest, and again, an initial summary of his testimony
- 8 for 15 or 20 minutes, and then AT&T has indicated a
- 9 cross-examination time of 30 to 60 minutes as has
- 10 Public Counsel for 30 to 60 minutes. So while we were
- 11 off the record, I left it up to AT&T and Public Counsel
- 12 to decide who will bat first, and we will likely not
- 13 get through both sets of cross-examination on Monday
- 14 afternoon, and we will end by 5:30 that day and start
- again at 9:30 on Tuesday morning the 14th with the
- 16 cross-examination of Mr. Teitzel.
- 17 Assuming we finish with Mr. Teitzel,
- 18 midmorning we will begin with the compliance issues.
- 19 If not, we will begin at 1:30 after lunch, and we have
- 20 designated a time at three o'clock for Ms. Doberneck to
- 21 call in and address the issues of loop qualifications,
- 22 and on those issues, Qwest will have 10 minutes, and on
- 23 the first issue, the manual look-up issue, Qwest will
- 24 have 10 minutes -- I'm sorry, 15 minutes if need be,
- 25 and AT&T and Covad will split 15 minutes, and on the

- 1 audits issue, Qwest and AT&T will each have five
- 2 minutes. So I think that deals with our scheduling
- 3 issues, except that instead of having the parties there
- 4 on Monday at 8:30, I don't need you there until 9:30
- 5 for any prehearing matters.
- 6 Turning to the exhibits, while we are off the
- 7 record, we started marking exhibits, and we started
- 8 with No. 1625, and although there is no testimony
- 9 associated with it, these are Public Counsel's
- 10 exhibits, and 1625 will be Exhibit A. 1626 is Exhibit
- 11 B. Actually, they were appendices, so Appendix A and
- 12 Appendix B. 1627 is Appendix C. 1628 is Appendix D.
- 13 1629 is Appendix E. 1630 is Appendix F. 1631 is
- 14 Appendix G. 1632 is Appendix H. 1633 is Appendix I.
- 15 1634 is Appendix K, and 1635-C are the responses to
- 16 Bench Request 46, including any supplemental responses.
- 17 Then 1638 is designated as a Covad exhibit.
- 18 It's Covad's late-filed exhibit, FCC filing in response
- 19 to Exhibit 1657. 1640-T is the supplemental affidavit
- 20 by Ms. Roth for AT&T. 1641 is Exhibit A to that
- 21 affidavit. 1642 is Exhibit B. 1643 is Exhibit C.
- 22 1644 is Exhibit D. 1645 is Exhibit E. 1646 is Exhibit
- 23 F. 1647 is Exhibit G, and 1648 is Exhibit H. 1649 is
- 24 AT&T's late-filed response to Exhibit 1657 filed with
- 25 the FCC.

- 1 Then beginning with Exhibit 1655, the
- 2 supplemental rebuttal affidavit of Mr. Teitzel. 1656
- 3 is Exhibit DLT-11, and it is a white paper by
- 4 Dr. Hausman. 1657 is a May 2nd, 2002, letter from Kirk
- 5 Nelson of Qwest with attachments, and that will be
- 6 provided to the parties. Ms. Weber will make
- 7 arrangements for that to overnight copies to the
- 8 parties today.
- 9 Then turning to Exhibit 1665, these are
- 10 compliance exhibits. 1665 is Qwest's notice of the
- 11 updated SGAT filed on April 19th, 2002. Exhibit 1666
- 12 is the fifth revision to the SGAT, again, filed April
- 13 19th. Exhibit 1667 is the red-lined version of the
- 14 fifth revision to the SGAT filed April 19th. Exhibit
- 15 1668 we have designated for the May 10th compliance
- 16 filing Qwest is making in response to agreements
- 17 reached in the last hearing in April.
- 18 Exhibit 1670 is AT&T's response to Qwest's
- 19 demonstration of compliance as of April 19th, 2002, and
- 20 Exhibit 1671 is AT&T's response to the April 11th
- 21 filings filed with the commission on May 6th, and
- 22 finally, Exhibit 1675 is WorldCom's response to Qwest's
- 23 memorandum concerning remote deployment of DSL.
- And that covers the exhibits that we marked.
- 25 Is there anything that we discussed off the record that

- 1 I have not recorded now that we are back on the record?
- 2 MR. FRANKEL: I was just wondering whether it
- 3 made sense to talk about the possibility that Qwest may
- 4 need to file additional cross-examination exhibits for
- 5 Diane Roth, depending on the testimony that AT&T files
- 6 this afternoon, and the hopefully theoretical
- 7 possibility that Qwest may need to present an
- 8 additional witness.
- 9 JUDGE RENDAHL: Thank you for clarifying
- 10 that. While we are off the record, AT&T explained that
- 11 they would be filing a responsive affidavit by Ms. Roth
- 12 this afternoon and that Qwest reserved the right to
- 13 request another witness. In that case, I directed
- 14 Qwest to inform the commission and all other parties by
- 15 fax and electronically and include any time estimates
- 16 for that witness, and I think, Mr. Frankel, we also
- 17 discussed that if Qwest needs to file any
- 18 cross-examination exhibits in response to what Ms. Roth
- 19 files this afternoon that the same applies. Please
- 20 provide them by Friday and electronically, if possible,
- 21 so that I can include them in all of the commissioners'
- 22 binders and in my own binder in preparation for Monday,
- 23 and it will give the parties an opportunity to see
- 24 those exhibits as well. Does that address those
- 25 issues?

- 10 MR. FRANKEL: I'm also wondering whether it
- 11 makes sense to put on the record your guidance to all
- 12 the parties that the posthearing briefing be limited to
- 13 specific issues raised at the hearing and not to go
- 14 back and rebrief all the public interest issues.
- 15 JUDGE RENDAHL: I will do that, but I think
- 16 everyone is fully aware of that, because I advised the
- 17 parties before we even scheduled this matter that any
- 18 issues we take up now are separate from what we have
- 19 done before. So the briefing is limited to the matters
- 20 discussed at the hearing next week on public interest,
- 21 and those issues are not a recitation of what occurred
- 22 during the fourth workshop and the briefs and the oral
- 23 argument that already occurred on those matters but the
- 24 new issues raised by the parties here in this hearing.
