DECLARATION OF JASON L. BALL ON BEHALF OF COMMISSION STAFF

- I, Jason L. Ball, under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of Washington, declare as follows:
- I am over 18 years of age, a citizen of the United States, a resident of the State of Washington, and competent to be a witness.
- I am employed by the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) as a Regulatory Analyst in the Energy section. I have been employed in this position at the Commission since June 2013. As a regulatory analyst, my responsibilities include analyzing rate filings, preparing memoranda with detailed recommendations for the Commission, and testifying in rate cases on various issues. I have testified in several dockets including as the policy witness in the previous Pacific Power & Light Company (PPL) general rate case, Docket UE-140762.
- I oversaw the examination of the rate filing that PPL made with the Commission on November 25, 2015. The filing includes a petition for an expedited rate filing (ERF) and testimony and other exhibits supporting the ERF, a two-year rate plan, and a decoupling proposal.
- Commission Staff (Staff) reviewed the filing for compliance with the Commission's rules for rate filings and specifically the content requirements for a traditional energy general rate case, set forth in WAC 480-07-510.¹

¹ There are no rules in the Washington Administrative Code which outline the specific requirements of an ERF. Expedited Rate Filings were first proposed by Staff witness Ken Elgin in Dockets UE-111048 and

- Staff found the filing to be in compliance with WAC 480-07-510. Most importantly, the filing includes the direct testimony and exhibits of several witnesses, supporting documentation, and work papers for key issues. In Staff's opinion, the case contains the information that Staff needs to analyze PPL's proposals and, following opportunity for discovery, ultimately provide a recommendation to the Commission.
