- On January 13, 2010, the City of Fife (City) filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) a Petition to open a pedestrian only atgrade rail crossing at 54<sup>th</sup> Avenue East in the City of Fife. The City cites the need to construct the new crossing to accommodate the increase in pedestrian traffic due to increased development in the area.
- On January 25, 2010, the Commission sent a letter to Union Pacific Railroad notifying them of the petition and requesting they respond within twenty days, stating whether they support the petition.
- On February 12, 2010, Union Pacific Railroad filed with the Commission a letter opposing the proposed modifications to the crossing.
- STATUTORY AUTHORITY: The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter under RCW Title 81, and has legal authority to regulate alterations in the style or nature of construction of existing grade crossings, and to apportion the expense of such a change between the railroad and the municipality or county affected pursuant to RCW 81.53, including without limitation, RCW 81.53.060 and RCW 81.53.110. The statutes that apply to this matter include RCW 81.04, RCW 81.44, and RCW 81.53, including but not limited to RCW 81.04.110, RCW 81.44.010, RCW 81.53.060, RCW 81.53.261, and RCW 81.53.271.

The Commission will hear this matter under the Administrative Procedure Act (APA), particularly Part IV of RCW 34.05 relating to adjudications. The provisions of the APA that relate to this proceeding include, but are not limited to RCW 34.05.413, RCW 34.05.422, RCW 34.05.431, RCW 34.05.440, RCW 34.05.449, and RCW 34.05.452. The Commission will also follow its procedural rules in WAC 480-07 and WAC 480-62 in this proceeding.

- THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE That it will hold a prehearing conference in this matter at1:30 p.m., on May 3, 2010, in the Commission's Hearing Room, Second Floor, Richard Hemstad Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W., Olympia, Washington. Parties may participate in the prehearing conference via the Commission's conference bridge line (360) 664-3846. Parties who wish to participate via the bridge line should call the conference bridge approximately five minutes before the prehearing conference is scheduled to convene.
- The purpose of the prehearing conference is to consider requests for intervention, to identify the relevant issues in the proceeding, to resolve scheduling and other procedural matters, including establishing dates for distributing evidence and workpapers and evaluating the need for public comment hearing(s) on the petition, and to determine any other matters to assist the Commission in resolving these cases, as listed in WAC 480-07-430.
- INTERVENTION: Persons who wish to intervene should file a petition to intervene in writing at least three business days before the date of the prehearing conference. See WAC 480-07-355(a). The Commission will consider oral petitions to intervene during the conference, but strongly prefers written petitions to intervene. Party representatives must file a notice of appearance with the Commission no later than the business day before the conference. See WAC 480-07-345(2). Any party or witness in need of an interpreter or other assistance should fill out the form attached to this notice and return it to the Commission. The Commission will set the time and place for any evidentiary hearings at the prehearing conference, on the record of a later conference or hearing session, or by later written notice.
- 9 THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE that any party who fails to attend or participate in the prehearing conference set by this Notice, or any other stage of this proceeding, may be held in default under RCW 34.05.440 and WAC 480-07-450.
