Dear Ms. Leipski:

I write again regarding Docket No. TV-140664, which I protested on July 8, 2014. Noam Kalzan's application for a Household Goods Carrier Permit should be denied on the grounds of his unlicensed work and unfair competition, and out of concern for the public interest. This letter is to inform the UTC of further developments in this matter.

Neighbors Moving commenced a lawsuit against Mr. Kalzan on Aug. 5, 2014. The case is *Neighbors Moving & Storage of Seattle, LLC, v. Noam Kalzan*, King County Superior Court cause no. 14-2-00932-1. Mr. Kalzan failed to appear or defend in this case and, as a result, the court entered the attached default order and judgment against him on Aug. 29, 2014. Mr. Kalzan is ordered to cease and desist use of the name "Neighborhood Movers."

This order and judgment against Mr. Kalzan adds weight to my concerns about Mr. Kalzan's operation for four years without a UTC permit and his appropriation of his competitors' trade names. I urge to you consider these very serious issues as sufficient grounds for the Utilities and Transportation Commission to reject Mr. Kalzan's application for a permanent Household Goods Carrier Permit.

I reiterate my protest to his application on these grounds of his business practices and his confusing use of competitors' trade names and the public interest.
