Event Summary:


On September 11, 2017 at 0525, Kevlar Smith Wesson, age 47 was struck and fatally injured by a northbound BNSF freight train at milepost 97.0 on the Seattle Sub Division on main track one. The Kelso Police Department responded and investigated the incident. When they arrived, they found Mr. Wesson approximately 150 yards north of the overpass. The locomotive engineer stated he was traveling northbound when he noticed an individual standing on the west side of the track he was traveling on. He immediately sounded the horn and the conductor applied the brakes. The train was traveling at 40 miles per hour when it struck the individual. The Certificate of Death state the manner of death "undetermined".

Site Description:

There is an overcrossing 20 feet south from where the individual was struck with a private crossing underneath it. There are two mainline tracks and one stub track. There is 750 feet of sight distance to the south and 600 feet of sight distance to the north. There are several "No Trespassing" signs in the area as well as "No Trespassing" stamped on the overcrossing beams/supports.

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NARRATIVE:

On 09/11/2017 at approximately 0530 hours, I was dispatched to a train versus pedestrian accident at 100 Cowlitz Way.

I arrived on scene at approximately 0532 hours and contacted BNSF conductor, Seth Fisher. Fisher located a male lying face down on the ground and directed officers to him. Officers were unable to find a pulse and Cowlitz Two Fire and Rescue confirmed the male was deceased.

The man was located about 150 yards north of the Cowlitz Way Bridge in the gravel to the west of both main lines. He was positioned with his left knee up to his chest and his face was turned slightly towards the left. The man had some deep lacerations on his head, as well as on his thighs. His left arm and wrist were twisted in an abnormal way, but the body appeared fully intact. The man was clothed with two coats and tee shirt covering his torso, but only wearing boxer briefs. He was not wearing pants or shoes, which was confirmed by Fisher.

Fisher stated that he and the conductor, Ahmed Salaam, noticed the man standing on the west side of the railroad tie butt. Fisher stated the man's legs caught his attention as the man was not wearing any pants. Immediately after Fisher saw the man, he applied the train's horn, and stated the man began to "pivot on his left foot" as if to turn away from the train. Fisher estimated the train to be going approximately 40 mph and that Salaam applied the brakes as soon as he saw the man. Fisher stated the man did not travel more than 10 feet north from his initial point of impact.

BNSF police officer John Davis arrived a few moments later and took over the scene. Davis provided me with the train's identification and locomotive ID. The train's ID is H PASSEAI 10A and its locomotive ID is BNSF 8185. The man's body was located at the end of rail car BNSF 486662.

The man could not be identified, but had multiple identifying tattoos such as a large blue tattoo on his head that resembled a lightning bolt, as well as a Medusa tattoo on his right calf. He also had an anchor on his right calf, and a cheetah on the front of his left thigh.

Photos of the body were taken and are attached to the report and the body was released to the corner. Please forward a copy of this report to BNSF Police Officer John Davis and the Cowlitz County Coroner's Officer. Case is still active pending identification of the male.
