COMMISSION STAFF’S PROPOSED  
PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

1            On January 30, 2020, the Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) issued a Notice of Dates for Entry of Declaratory Order and Filing of Proposed Procedural Schedule (Notice). The Notice in part directed Commission staff (Staff), Puget Sound Energy (PSE), and any other interested persons to confer and propose a procedural schedule for the Commission’s consideration of PSE’s petition by February 13.

2            Staff has conferred with PSE and representatives from the Northwest Intermountain Power Producers Coalition and the Renewable Energy Coalition (NIPPC/REC), and both PSE and NIPPC/REC have stated that they do not object to the proposed procedural schedule below:
