## **BACKGROUND**

- On June 24, 1999, Lake Washington School District #414 ("School District") filed a formal complaint against Puget Sound Energy (PSE) claiming PSE had overcharged the School District on two construction projects in 1997 and 1998 and seeking a refund. On November 29, 1999 the School District filed an amended complaint.
- 2 On December 13, 1999, PSE filed an Answer and Affirmative Defense to the Amended Complaint.
- On January 20, 2000, the parties participated in a Settlement Conference with Administrative Law Judge Dennis Moss.
- 4 On February 14, 2000, the School District filed a request to withdraw the formal complaint.
- On March 29, 2000, Administrative Law Judge Marjorie Schaer entered an Initial Order Dismissing Complaint. The initial order was served on all parties of record.
- No petition for administrative review was filed within the 20 days allowed by rule for filing. In accordance with RCW 34.05.464 and WAC 480-09-780(6), the Commission adopts the Initial Order as its own for purposes of this proceeding.

## ORDER

7 THE COMMISSION ORDERS that the Initial Order dated March 29, 2000, is affirmed and adopted for purposes of this proceeding. In so doing,
