Bench Request 1

Please identify the instances where the Company abandoned or transferred facilities in lieu of removal when a customer requested permanent disconnection, noting whether the Company sought to preclude subsequent use of those facilities by another electric service provider.

Response to Bench Request 1

Please see Attachment Bench Request 1, which includes a list of the permanent disconnection requests from 2002 to present where facilities were abandoned or transferred. The Company has also included clarification on whether the facilities were located in the public right-of-way or on private property

The Company previously indicated that a bill of sale associated with the permanent disconnection request for the City of Walla Walla water plant included a statement prohibiting another electric service provider from using the facilities. The original bill of sale presented to the City included that provision. However, in the process of responding to this Bench Request, the Company located correspondence in which the City refused to agree to the prohibition of future use by another electric service provider and stated it would pursue condemnation if the Company did not agree to the terms as presented by the City. In light of the terms of the franchise agreement and possible condemnation proceedings, the Company agreed to remove the disputed provision from the bill of sale.

Bench Request 2

Provide the date on which Pacific Power & Light Company's ("Pacific Power" or the "Company") policy for permanent disconnection changed to no longer include the sale and transfer of facilities in lieu of removal.

Response to Bench Request 2

On or about March 9, 2015, Pacific Power implemented its policy prohibiting offering a customer requesting permanent disconnection the option of purchasing underground facilities in lieu of removal of those facilities. The policy is the result of a Pacific Power's assessment of data, accumulated since the Commission approved the net removal tariff in 2002, demonstrating the operational and safety issues arising from a customer requesting permanent disconnection.
