Pac-West Telecomm, Inc. ("Pac-West"), by its attorneys, respectfully responds to Verizon Northwest Inc.'s ("Verizon") Proposed Schedule that was filed in the above-referenced proceeding on August 27, 2004. Pac-West supports the Competitive Carrier Coalition's recommendation but believes that the Commission, while dismissing Verizon's Arbitration Petition or abating the resolution of the issues that Verizon raised in its Petition, can still move forward with respect to non-cost issues raised by CLECs in response to Verizon's Petition. These issues, such as Verizon's obligation to offer Commingling, Combinations and Routine Network Modifications, are effectively counterclaims to Verizon's Petition and are ripe for Commission resolution at this juncture.

Significantly, the contract language proposed by Pac-West with respect to such issues has not changed since it filed its response to Verizon's Arbitration Petition back on April 13, 2004 because Verizon's obligations in this regard were not overturned by *USTA II and are effective*. Resolution of the issues, however, has been extensively deferred mainly as a result of Verizon's repeated desire to amend its amendment. Because the Commission will have to address these issues regardless of what amendment Verizon ultimately seeks to arbitrate, the Commission should address the commingling, combination, and routine network modification issues immediately. Verizon agrees that these non-cost issues are legal in nature and can be resolved on the basis of briefs alone (no pre-filed testimony or hearing is necessary). Pac-West therefore proposes that the Commission move forward with the arbitration with respect to these issues and adopt the following arbitration schedule:

September 17, 2004 Submission of Joint Issues Lists Associated with Verizon's Obligation to Offer Commingling, Combinations and Routine Network Modifications.
