My name is Ann Rendahl, the administrative 5 law judge presiding over this proceeding. We are here before the Washington Utilities and Transportation 6 7 Commission this morning, Tuesday, March 30th, 2004, for a prehearing conference in Docket No. UT-033011, 8 9 Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission 10 versus Advanced TeleCom, et al. 11 On February 12th, the Commission entered 12 Order No. 05 in this proceeding resolving the parties' 13 dispositive motions, so the Commission convened this 14 prehearing this morning to discuss the status of the 15 proceeding, identify and narrow the remaining issues, 16 and set a procedural schedule for evidentiary hearings 17 in the proceeding. Before we go any farther, let's take 18 19 appearances from the parties. If you've already stated 20 an appearance in this proceeding, please state your 21 name and identify the party you represent. Otherwise,

Qwest and have entered an appearance previously. 1 2 JUDGE RENDAHL: Just as a reminder for those of you on the bridge line, it's sometimes difficult for 3 4 the court reporter to hear you, so if you can make sure 5 you speak up and speak directly into the hand set, that б would be helpful. 7 Ms. Anderl, are there any changes to the Appendix A list; are you aware? 8 9 MS. ANDERL: It looks correct to me, Your 10 Honor. 11 JUDGE RENDAHL: Okay. Mr. Spivack, is the 12 information for Hogan and Hartson correct? It would be yourself, Ms. Russo, and Ms. Mitchell. 13 MR. SPIVACK: Yes, that is correct. 14 15 JUDGE RENDAHL: I believe that ATG is no 16 longer a party. I'm going to take them off the service 17 list. MR. CONNORS: Bill Connors with Miller Nash, 18 19 and we would agree with that. I formally represent ATG 20 in this matter. 21 JUDGE RENDAHL: You are here Mr. Connors. 22 I'm sorry. So we will take ATG off. MR. CONNORS: But I also represent Covad, but 23 24 Karen Frame is on the line as well, and I will let Ms. Frame handle the Covad. 25

JUDGE RENDAHL: Let's go first to AT&T and 1 2 then we will go to Covad. Is there anyone here 3 representing AT&T on the line? 4 MR. KOPTA: Your Honor, this is Gregory 5 Kopta. I'm actually representing two other parties, but our firm is representing AT&T, and if no one else б from our firm is on, then I'll take that 7 8 responsibility. 9 JUDGE RENDAHL: Thank you, Mr. Kopta. Could 10 you state your appearance then for all parties that you 11 represent? 12 MR. KOPTA: All parties that I represent. 13 Gregory Kopta of the law firm Davis Wright Tremaine, LLP, on behalf of AT&T Communications of the Pacific 14 15 Northwest and TCG Seattle, Global Crossing Local 16 Services, and XO Washington. I don't know whether I've 17 given my full name and address or not, but I can do that at this point if you would prefer. 18 19 JUDGE RENDAHL: I think you've done that 20 before. I believe you have, and we do have the 21 information on the service list, so I think that would 22 be sufficient. 23 MR. KOPTA: Thank you. 24 JUDGE RENDAHL: For Covad, Ms. Frame?

25 MS. FRAME: Karen Frame, Your Honor, with

Covad Communications. I believe you have all our 1 information on the list, but I don't believe that I 2 3 personally have entered an appearance officially. 4 JUDGE RENDAHL: Why don't you go ahead, 5 please. б MS. FRAME: So it's Karen Frame, K-a-r-e-n, 7 F-r-a-m-e, senior counsel with Covad Communications Company. The address is 7901 Lowry Boulevard, 8 9 L-o-w-r-y, Boulevard, Denver, Colorado, 80230. My telephone number is (720) 208-1069. My facsimile is 10 11 (720) 208-3350, and e-mail is kframe@covad.com. We do 12 need to remove Charles Watkins from the service list, 13 and we'll keep Bill Connors on. JUDGE RENDAHL: How about Mr. Harlow? 14 15 MS. FRAME: Bill, does Brooks still want a 16 copy? I don't think Brooks really needs a copy. 17 MR. CONNORS: We can remove Mr. Harlow from the list as well. 18 19 MS. FRAME: We really need only two attorneys 20 on this matter. 21 JUDGE RENDAHL: Would you prefer to receive 22 the paper and fax copy, Ms. Frame, or does Mr. Connors 23 need the copy? 24 MS. FRAME: I would prefer to receive both the paper and e-mail copies, and Bill, do you want a 25

1 paper copy as well? 2 MS. FRAME: The e-mail is fine with us. JUDGE RENDAHL: Mr. Connors, why don't you 3 4 state your appearance now and for any other parties you 5 represent in addition to Covad. 6 MR. CONNORS: William R. Conners with Miller 7 Nash representing Covad. JUDGE RENDAHL: Are there any other parties 8 9 now that ATG is gone? MR. CONNORS: No, Your Honor. 10 11 JUDGE RENDAHL: So we'll include Ms. Frame 12 with paper and fax copies and e-mail service to you, 13 Mr. Connors. MR. AHLERS: Yes, Your Honor, Dennis Ahlers for Eschelon, and the information on the service list 5 6 is correct. 7 MS. ENDEJAN: And it's correct for Graham and Dunn as well. 8 JUDGE RENDAHL: Thank you. For Fairpoint 9 Carrier Services? 10 11 MR. NYHUS: I'm Mark Nyhus making an 12 appearance for the first time on behalf of Fairpoint 13 Carrier Services, Inc. My address is 2405 Evergreen Park Drive Southwest, Suite B-1, Olympia, Washington, 14 15 98502. 16 JUDGE RENDAHL: Would you spell your last 17 name, please? 18 MR. 1 service? 2 MR. NYHUS: Yes, please. JUDGE RENDAHL: Is that the same for the 3 4 other parties that Mr. Finnigan represents? 5 MR. NYHUS: Yes, for Integra Telecom and SBC Telecom, Inc., as well. 6 7 JUDGE RENDAHL: Thank you, Mr. Nyhus. Mr. Kopta, for Global Crossing, I do believe right now 8 9 we do have Mr. Trinchero on for Global Crossing. Why 10 don't you make a formal appearance and we'll record it 11 for Global Crossing and for XO. 12 MR. KOPTA: Yes. Mark Trinchero should be 13 removed from the service list for Global Crossing Local Services, Inc., and I should be substituted, Gregory 14 15 Kopta of the law firm Davis Wright Tremaine. 16 The client representative, I'm not sure that 17 is correct. I will send a follow-up letter once I confirm who the client representative should be for 18 19 Global Crossing. For XO Washington, the client 20 information there is incorrect. It should be Rex 21 Knowles, but I will provide again the proper contact 22 information for Mr. Knowles. JUDGE RENDAHL: Thank you. Mr. Nyhus, for 23 24 Integra, are you aware of whether Karen Johnson should 25 remain on the service list?

MR. NYHUS: Her name should remain, Your 1 2 Honor. JUDGE RENDAHL: Thank you. For McLeod USA? 3 4 MR. LIPSCHULTZ: I'm Dan Lipschultz, and this 5 is my first appearance. ANDERL: Before we go on, are we to 14 remove anyone for McLeod? 15 JUDGE RENDAHL: Mr. Lipschultz, is the 16 information that you received by e-mail correct? 17 MR. LIPSCHULTZ: Thank you for reminding me. David Conn should be removed. 18 19 JUDGE RENDAHL: Should Ms. Harding remain? 20 MR. LIPSCHULTZ: I think for now, replace 21 Lauraine Harding with William Courter, C-o-u-r-t-e-r, 22 and the address is the same. JUDGE RENDAHL: Do you know if he's a senior 23 24 manager. 25 MR. LIPSCHULTZ: He's actually senior

counsel, and I'll give you his phone number. It's 1 2 (319) 790-6242. JUDGE RENDAHL: And I'm assuming the fax 3 4 number would remain the same. 5 MR. LIPSCHULTZ: Yes. JUDGE RENDAHL: Do you knows his e-mail б 7 address? MR. LIPSCHULTZ: I do. It's with 8 9 wcourter@mcleodusa.com. JUDGE RENDAHL: Thank you. For Time Warner, 10 11 Mr. Butler? 12 MR. BUTLER: I'm Art Butler, and the contact 13 information remains the same. JUDGE RENDAHL: So you are representing Time 14 15 Warner Telecom. 16 MR. BUTLER: Yes, and WorldCom. 17 JUDGE RENDAHL: Is the contact information correct for WorldCom? 18 19 MR. BUTLER: Yes. 20 MR. CROMWELL: Your Honor just for the 21 record, I know from personal experience that their 22 domain has changed to mci.com, so I assume the entry 23 for Ms. Davary has changed on her e-mail address. Is 24 that correct, Art? 25 MR. BUTLER: I had better confirm that. I

think it still works, but I'll double-check that. 1 JUDGE RENDAHL: I'm pretty sure in past cases 2 it's now WorldCom Inc., and its subsidiaries in 3 4 Washington, n/k/a MCI, Inc. 5 MR. BUTLER: Yes. JUDGE RENDAHL: I'll clarify that. For б 7 public counsel, Mr. Cromwell? MR. CROMWELL: Robert Cromwell, assistant 8 9 attorney general on behalf of public counsel. My 10 contact information remains the same. 11 JUDGE RENDAHL: Thank you very much, and 12 thanks for bearing with me as we go through those 13 details. Mr. Swanson, could you please briefly 14 15 summarize where we are in this proceeding, and if you 16 are at liberty, if the parties are engaged in any 17 settlement negotiations? MR. SWANSON: Certainly, Your Honor. Chris 18 Swanson for Commission staff. On the first issue of 19 20 where we are in this proceeding, I believe that Order 21 No. 5 was issued in that related to the multiple 22 motions for summary disposition in this matter and resolved those motions, and at this point, Staff 23 24 believes that the proper thing to do at this point is 25 set a procedural schedule, and I also wanted to mention

that although the discovery rule was previously invoked in this matter, we did want to let folks know that perhaps Staff would be providing notice of depositions in this matter and haven't gotten in the details of that yet but would comply with all the proper procedures to do that.

7 In terms of settlement discussions, there 8 have been a few settlement discussions -- nothing 9 formal at this point -- with a few of the parties, but 10 Staff is hopeful and anticipates that one or more of 11 the parties may settle.

JUDGE RENDAHL: Okay. As the parties may know, the Commission stands available to assist in any settlement discussions or mediation. If the parties believe that's appropriate, please notify me and we can make an administrative law judge available for mediation purposes.

At this point, it sounds like we need to go 18 forward and set a procedural schedule for hearings and 19 20 discovery. Because there is no time clock in this 21 proceeding, unlike a rate case, we don't have an end 22 point to work backwards from. When that's the case, I 23 usually come in with some sort of a proposed schedule, 24 but I have none, and I'm wondering if the parties have given this any thought. 25

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1	MR. SWANSON: Chris Swanson for Commission								
2	staff. I haven't had a chance to speak to all the								
3	parties. I have spoken to Ms. Anderl a little bit								
4	about a possible schedule, and I think what we talked								
5	about was looking at when the Commission was available								
б	and perhaps working back from that time to provide								
7	opportunities for all the filings, and I think that								
8	what we were thinking about, at least in terms of								
9	Commission staff, was probably a one-week hearing in								
10	this matter, so that probably would be helpful in								
11	looking when the Commission might be available.								
12	JUDGE RENDAHL: I do know the commissioners								
13	intend to preside in this hearing, so I do have their								
14	calendar with me. Was there any particular time frame								
15	you were looking at for a hearing?								
16	MR. SWANSON: Preliminarily, we were looking								
17	at early October, perhaps, for a hearing, but I								
18	understood that perhaps the Commissioners wasn't								
19	available then but might be available sometime not too								
20	far off from that date.								
21	JUDGE RENDAHL: The Commission is available								
22	the first two weeks of October. The last two weeks,								
23	they are involved in the Verizon model interconnection								
24	agreement SGAT hearings from the 18th through the 27th,								
25	and then in November, the first week of November is								

available. Actually, the entire month, there are no hearings scheduled before the Commission currently in November, so I would say the first two weeks of October and the entire month of November are available, which is pretty amazing at this point. Let's be off the record while we have these discussions, and then we can go back on the record once we've completed.

(Discussion off the record.)

9 JUDGE RENDAHL: While we were off the record, 10 the parties discussed scheduling and came up with a 11 schedule. The parties will file a stipulation of fact 12 and law, if possible, on May 3rd, 2004. It's a Monday. 13 Direct testimony in this case is due on June 1st, which 14 is a Tuesday. Responses are due on August 2nd, which 15 is a Monday, and reply testimony is due on September 16 27th, which is also a Monday.

17 The prehearing conference for marking exhibits and finalizing the schedule for the hearing 18 will be Tuesday, October the 26th, and in my prehearing 19 conference order, I will include a notice that witness 20 21 lists, exhibit lists, and cross-examination exhibit 22 lists would need to be filed with the Commission 23 electronically by noon on October 25th, which is a 24 Monday, so that I can put together a list and include 25 some numbers.

Then the parties agreed that the week of 1 November 1st through 5th will work for hearing and 2 3 identified an initial brief filing date of December 3rd 4 and a responsive brief filing date of December the 5 17th. The parties discussed discovery, identified that Staff may wish to depose certain Qwest witnesses or 6 7 personnel who may not have been identified yet as witnesses, and I understand that those parties will 8 9 work with each other, and at this point, there is no 10 need for a discovery schedule, but if the parties have 11 disputes and need those resolved or need to have some 12 schedule for discovery, please contact me and we will 13 work through that.

14 Is there anything else we need to address on 15 the record? I think the only other thing we talked 16 about off the record was scoping of the issues, which 17 led to our discussion of the stipulation of fact, and that is that the Order No. 5 dismissed the first cause 18 of action and the fourth cause of action, and that the 19 20 second, third, fifth through seventh causes of action, 21 including the element of time limits of filing in this 22 issue, remain in this proceeding. Is there anything 23 else we need to address on the record? Hearing nothing, we will be adjourned. Thank you very much for 24 your calling in and being here this morning. We are 25
