1 LACEY, WASHINGTON; JULY 15, 2019 2 9:30 A.M. 3 ------4 PROCEEDINGS 5 6 JUDGE PEARSON: Let's be on the record in 7 Docket TR-190228, which is a petition filed by Clark 8 County seeking to install median barriers at a highway 9 rail-grade crossing in Vancouver, Washington. Today is Monday, July 15th, 2019, at 9:30 10 a.m., and we're here for a prehearing conference to 11 12 discuss scheduling and other procedural issues. 13 My name is Rayne Pearson. I'm the 14 administrative law judge presiding over this case. So let's begin by taking short appearances. 15 16 We'll start with Staff and then we will identify the 17 parties on the bridge line. 18 So, Mr. Roberson? 19 MR. ROBERSON: Good morning. My name is Jeff Roberson, R-o-b-e-r-s-o-n. My contact information 20 is on file in the docket. I'm an assistant attorney 21 22 general representing Staff, and with me at counsel table 23 is Ms. Betty Young who is Staff's witness. 24 JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you. 25 And for the County, Ms. Cook, I understand

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you're here on behalf of Taylor Hallvik and you're on 1 2 the bridge line. Could you please enter an appearance? MS. COOK: Yes, my name is Christine Cook. 3 4 I'm a senior deputy prosecuting attorney with Clark County, Washington, and I am here filling in for Taylor 5 6 Hallvik who is a deputy prosecuting attorney for Clark 7 County, Washington. And we are here to represent the 8 County in the scheduling matter. 9 Also with me is Ahmad Qayoumi, who is the 10 director of the public works department, and his last name is spelled O-a-y-o-u-m-i. And Rob Klug, who is the 11 12 interim transportation manager with the County 13 Department of Public Works. 14 JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you. 15 And for BN --16 MR. OWSLEY: Hello? 17 JUDGE PEARSON: Mr. Owsley? Thank you, Your Honor. 18 MR. OWSLEY: Good morning. Travis Owsley, O-w-s-l-e-y, appearing on 19 behalf of BNSF Railway Company. Contact information is 20 on file with the docket. 21 22 JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you. 23 Is there anyone else on the bridge line who 24 wishes to enter an appearance? 25 Okay. Hearing nothing, I assume, then, that

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1 there is no one on the bridge line seeking to intervene 2 in this proceeding?

Okay. Also, hearing nothing, I do have a 3 question for BNSF before we get on to the other 4 5 procedural matters. With respect to the April 4th 6 letter that was mailed to BNSF from the Commission's 7 transportation safety director, Kathy Hunter, there was 8 a letter requesting BNSF to review Clark County's petition and respond by either completing the waiver of 9 hearing form or providing a written response stating 10 BNSF's reasons for not supporting the petition, and my 11 12 understanding is that BNSF took neither of these 13 actions.

So, Mr. Owsley, if you could just state for the record BNSF's position on the petition?

16 MR. OWSLEY: Yes, Your Honor. First, my 17 apologies for that. Stated briefly, Your Honor, BNSF's position is that given the -- the -- the geometry of 18 this crossing and, you know, other physical 19 circumstances to it, feel that a Qwick Kurb median is 20 insufficient nor preferred. Commission considers -- the 21 22 County would consider a -- a nontraversable median as a 23 safety measure at this crossing.

JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. I figured that wasthe case, but I just wanted you to state that for the

1 record.

2 So moving on to procedural issues. Do the parties want the discovery rules to be available in this 3 4 case? MR. ROBERSON: They probably should be. 5 6 JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. And that brings us to 7 the schedule. Do the parties need a recess to discuss 8 scheduling? I saw that there was a proposed schedule 9 circulated last week, but I didn't hear whether or not 10 Staff was amenable to that proposed schedule. 11 Staff has no objections to MR. ROBERSON: 12 the schedule, Your Honor. 13 JUDGE PEARSON: So it sounds like you have an agreed schedule. Do you want to read that into the 14 record? Do you have it? 15 16 MR. ROBERSON: Absolutely. Per the 17 procedural schedule the parties now agree to, there is a settlement conference scheduled for 18 September 12th, 2019; Clark County's direct testimony 19 would be due September 30th, 2019; answering -- or 20 21 sorry, the response testimony would be due 22 October 28th, 2019. 23 JUDGE PEARSON: You said October 28th? 24 MR. ROBERSON: Yes. 25 JUDGE PEARSON: Okay.

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Page 7 MR. ROBERSON: Cross-answering testimony and 1 rebuttal would be due December 2nd, 2019; the discovery 2 cutoff is January 6th, 2020; exhibits, witness list, and 3 time estimates are due to ALD on January 20th, 2020; the 4 hearing would be held February 27th, 2020; and 5 post-hearing briefs would be due March 26th, 2020. 6 7 Okay. Thank you. JUDGE PEARSON: 8 MR. ROBERSON: And there is one caveat that I have not checked with ALD to make sure that the 9 hearing date is acceptable. 10 JUDGE PEARSON: I believe it is, but I'll 11 12 check real quick on my calendar. I'm free that day, so 13 that works. 14 MR. ROBERSON: Apologies, Your Honor. 15 JUDGE PEARSON: That's okay. 16 Okay. So we will reserve a room at the Commission for the hearing. I assume you only think it 17 will take one day, is that -- I think that's accurate. 18 So it's incumbent upon the parties to find a facility in 19 or near Vancouver to host the hearing, and if you have 20 not secured a space and notified me of that location at 21 22 least 45 days before the hearing date, we will hold the hearing here at the Commission's headquarters in Lacey. 23 24 So please make sure you notify me directly when you 25 secure a location.

Page 8 The County would be happy to try 1 MS. COOK: 2 to find a room at Clark County that would be suitable for a hearing, and we will get back with you on that as 3 4 soon as we can. 5 JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Great. Thank you. 6 And just keep in mind too that we will need the space in 7 the evening for a public comment hearing that same day, 8 on February 27th. 9 MS. COOK: Okay. 10 JUDGE PEARSON: All right. 11 That might -- that might make it MS. COOK: 12 more difficult, but I will check that out. 13 JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you. In the past, we have used Council Chambers in Whatcom County, I 14 believe, rooms at their courthouses, so that might be 15 16 something. I don't know if that's available. 17 MS. COOK: Council Chambers would be very appropriate for this. Usually, unfortunately, there 18 is -- well, it may not be on this Thursday. There are 19 Thursday nights when the Planning Commission holds a 20 hearing in the chambers, but, again, I will look to that 21 22 and confirm whether or not we have space available. 23 JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. The other thing we 24 can do, because it is so far out, is we can -- we can 25 change the hearing date if we need to.

Page 9 1 MS. COOK: Okay. JUDGE PEARSON: So just be in contact with 2 the parties, and Mr. Roberson can communicate with me 3 4 whatever you all decide. 5 MS. COOK: Okay. 6 JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. 7 Thank you, Your Honor, I will do MS. COOK: 8 that. 9 JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Is there anything else that we need to address while we're here today? 10 11 MR. ROBERSON: Not from Staff. 12 MR. OWSLEY: Nothing from BNSF, Your Honor. 13 JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you. 14 Ms. Cook, nothing else? 15 MS. COOK: Nothing from the County. 16 JUDGE PEARSON: Okay, great. I will issue 17 an order reflecting what we discussed here today and we are adjourned.
