- 18 If you choose to testify about how you are
- 19 getting out of the household goods business, I will
- 20 allow you to make a statement explaining how you plan to
- do that and depending on what proof you can provide, you
- 22 should be able to reach an agreed order resolving the
- 23 Commission -- resolving the matter with Commission
- 24 Staff, and you can speak to Ms. Jones about that during
- 25 the recess.

- to 1 If you choose to contest the allegations in
 - 2 the complaint, we'll schedule another court appearance
 - 3 for the Commission to present the necessary evidence to
 - prove its case, and I'll explain the types of
 - 5 documentation you would need to bring in order to
 - 6 dispute the Commission's evidence.
 - 7 So after I hear from each of your companies,
 - 8 we will take a break for probably about an hour, and
 - 9 that will provide Commission Staff time to meet with
