6	JUDGE CHARTOFF: Let's be on the record.
7	Good morning. This is Docket TV-171185, which is
8	captioned In the Matter of the Investigation of Urban
9	Delivery Service LLC For Compliance with Washington
10	Administrative Code 480-15-560 and Washington
11	Administrative Code 480-15-570.
12	My name is Laura Chartoff. I am the
13	administrative law judge presiding over today's brief
14	adjudicative proceeding.
15	Today is Friday, February 23rd, 2018, and
16	the time is approximately 9:30 a.m.
17	We're here today because Commission Staff
18	performed a safety investigation of Urban Delivery
19	Service LLC and documented 133 critical violations
20	resulting in a proposed unsatisfactory safety rating.
21	The company has 60 days from the day it received the
22	notice of the unsatisfactory rating to obtain Commission
23	approval of a safety management plan. And on
24	January 16th, 2018, the Commission gave notice of intent
25	to cancel the company's certificate as a household goods

- 1 carrier, and notice of this brief adjudicative
- <sup>2</sup> proceeding setting time for oral statements.
- <sup>3</sup> This proceeding is to determine whether the
- 4 Commission should cancel Urban Delivery Service LLC's
- <sup>5</sup> household goods carrier permit effective
- <sup>6</sup> February 28th, 2018.
- 7 So let's begin by taking appearances
- <sup>8</sup> starting with Staff.
- 9 MR. SHEARER: Good morning, Your Honor. My
- <sup>10</sup> name is Brett Shearer. I am assistant attorney general
- 11 and representing the Commission Staff in this
- <sup>12</sup> proceeding.
- <sup>13</sup> JUDGE CHARTOFF: Thank you.
- 14 Is there anyone here for the company? Is
- 15 there anyone in the room or on the phone line for Urban
- <sup>16</sup> Delivery Service LLC?
- <sup>17</sup> Okay. Let the record reflect that the
- <sup>18</sup> company has failed to appear.
- <sup>19</sup> MR. SHEARER: So, Your Honor, Staff would
- <sup>20</sup> ask for a default order against Urban Delivery Service,
- and in that order to enforce the full penalty assessment
- <sup>22</sup> to cancel the company's certificate and authority to
- <sup>23</sup> operate, and require the company to cease and desist its
- <sup>24</sup> operations. And Staff would also request permission to
- <sup>25</sup> continue the proceeding today and place the evidentiary

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1	basis of its recommendation into the record.
2	JUDGE CHARTOFF: Thank you.
3	Okay. I find Urban Delivery Service LLC in
4	default and will issue a written order reflecting this
5	finding. And at this time, Staff can present its case.
6	MR. SHEARER: Thank you, Your Honor. I
7	would like to call Mr. Wayne Gilbert to testify on
8	behalf of Staff.
9	JUDGE CHARTOFF: Mr. Gilbert, please stand
10	and raise your right hand.
11	
12	WAYNE GILBERT, witness herein, having been
13	first duly sworn on oath,
14	was examined and testified
15	as follows:
16	
17	JUDGE CHARTOFF: You may be seated.
18	MR. SHEARER: Thank you, Your Honor. Just a
19	little bit of quick housekeeping before I start. The
20	exhibits Staff filed in this, WG-1 through WG-4, I'm
21	actually going to be going through them in reverse
22	order. So we'll probably start at 4 and work our way
23	back.
24	JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay.

Docket No. TV-171185 - Vol. I 1 EXAMINATION 2 BY MR. SHEARER: 3 Q. Good morning, Mr. Gilbert. 4 A. Good morning. 5 Q. Can you please state your full name and spell 6 your last name for the record? 7 A. Wayne Gilbert, G-i-l-b-e-r-t. 8 Q. And, Mr. Gilbert, what is your role here at the 9 UTC? 10 A. Motor carrier safety investigator. 11 Q. And did you have a role in the Docket TV-171185 12 relating to Urban Delivery Service LLC?

- 13 **A. Yes, I did.**
- 14 Q. And what was your role?
- **A.** My role was this was assigned as a routine
- 16 safety investigation, safety audit to determine
- 17 operating authority. All new entrant carriers go
- 18 through this for household goods delivery. Within 18
- <sup>19</sup> months, they need to receive a new entrant safety audit
- and receive a satisfactory safety record in regards to
- 21 that audit in order to receive permanent operating
- authority within the state of Washington.
- 23 Q. And did you personally conduct that audit and
- <sup>24</sup> review?
- <sup>25</sup> **A. Yes, I did.**

1	Q. And what did your review of Urban Delivery
2	Service LLC entail, Mr. Gilbert?
3	A. It entailed several violations when I initially
4	actually visited Urban Delivery Services LLC, beginning
5	on page 4 of 22.
6	Q. And this is Exhibit WG-4; is that correct?
7	A. Correct. Found several critical violations
8	within the operations of Urban Delivery LLC starting
9	with No. 1, which was a violation of the primary
10	regulation of 391.45(a) of the MCSRs, using drivers not
11	medically examined and/or certified. Mr. Duryea had
12	operated on four different oc or four different
13	drivers without receiving any medical certification.
14	Q. And I'll take a step back.
15	The document we have entered as WG-4, do you
16	recognize that document as the true and correct copy of
17	your report your audit of Urban Delivery Service LLC?
18	A. Yes, I do.
19	Q. Thank you.
20	Please continue to describe the violations you
21	discovered and documented in your report, Mr. Gilbert.
22	A. The first one was no medical certificates. The
23	second one related to maintaining driver qualification
24	files, a violation of 391.51(a), which was also a
25	critical item.

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1	Moving on to page 5, was also a critical
2	violation. This is a violation of WAC 480-15-555,
3	failing to conduct and/or retain paperwork contained or
4	relating to criminal background checks for household
5	goods carriers. Mr. Duryea was operating with three
6	drivers that had not received criminal background
7	checks, and nor did he conduct any of them as admitted
8	by him.
9	No. 4 was 395.8(a), relating to driver time
10	cards, so a record of duty status. Urban Delivery LLC
11	had not completed any record of duty status. There was
12	a total of 120. This was 30 days per driver and the
13	total of four drivers, so equalled 120 days total they
14	did not conduct any record of duty status.
15	No. 5 on that same sheet, violation of 396.3(b),
16	failing to keep minimum records of inspection of vehicle
17	maintenance for both the vehicles that Mr. Duryea was
18	operating. Had no no vehicle inspections or no
19	records of maintenance or anything on the vehicles.
20	Moving on to page 6, these were just minor
21	paperwork violations. The first one, 392.2, operating a
22	commercial motor vehicle in accordance not in
23	accordance with laws. This is local jurisdictional
24	laws. Mr. Duryea himself was cited by Washington State
25	Patrol at milepost 142 on Interstate 5 for speeding and

1	being in the left lane of a three-lane interstate. So
2	this was a local violation.
3	And then No. 7 is 396.17(a), using a commercial
4	motor vehicle not periodically inspected. One of two
5	vehicles need both vehicles, all commercial motor
6	vehicles need to receive an annual vehicle inspection
7	per DOT guidance. And only one of the vehicles had
8	received one, the other one did not.
9	Q. Mr. Gilbert, you just walked through a whole
10	host of violations, many of which were critical and
11	documented in your report pages 3 through 6 in WG-4, the
12	exhibit we've labeled as WG-4. Why are those
13	violations and I'm specifically referring to the
14	critical violations, why are those a concern for UTC
15	Staff?
16	A. It's violation of the Federal Motor Carrier
17	Safety regulations, which is basic safety regulations
18	regarding operation of all commercial motor vehicles on
19	all public roadways.
20	Q. And on that last page that you referenced there,
21	what was the result of your review?
22	A. The result of the review was an unsatisfactory
23	safety rating.
24	Q. And what does an unsatisfactory safety
25	meeting rating mean?

1	A. Means that the operations of Urban Delivery	
2	Services are considered unsafe for public roadways.	
3	Q. And how do you determine this unsatisfactory	
4	rating?	
5	A. It's based on the number of violations, and it's	
6	all added together within our system once we put it into	
7	our system, and it actually comes up with different	
8	factors. Referring to page 15 of 22, there's the	
9	"Safety Fitness Rating Explanation," and failing more	
10	than two factors within that would result in an	
11	unsatisfactory safety rating. Mr. Duryea failed both	
12	factor two and factor three of that of this safety	
13	fitness rating, and then factor four received a	
14	conditional resulting in an overall unsatisfactory	
15	rating for Urban Delivery Services.	
16	Q. So is it your opinion that Urban Delivery	
17	Service LLC is not fit to operate on the roads in	
18	Washington State?	
19	A. Yes, it is.	
20	Q. Did you attempt to communicate your findings and	
21	the findings of your report to the company?	
22	A. That I did on several different occasions. I'd	
23	actually attempted to contact from the time that we	
24	initially visited the carrier. I attempted to contact	
25	Mr. Duryea of Urban Delivery Services on a total of 12	
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1	diffe	rent occasions.	
2	Q.	And did you keep a record of your attempts to	
3	comr	nunicate with this company?	
4	Α.	That I did.	
5	Q.	Do you recognize the document I'll hand you now	
6	we've	e labeled as Exhibit WG-3, do you recognize that	
7	docu	ment as a true and a correct copy of your	
8	comr	nunication logs, your attempts to contact Urban	
9	Deliv	ery Service?	
10	Α.	Yes, it is.	
11	Q.	And how did you finally determine how did you	
12	communicate your findings to the company?		
13	Α.	Based on numerous failed attempts to actually	
14	both	physically driving up there, through numerous phone	
15	calls	, emails. In the end, we had to settle for both an	
16	emai	I copy that was sent, also sent an actual certified

19	Q.	And did you receive a confirmation of receipt of	
20	your	certified mail delivery?	
21	Α.	That we did.

24	corre	ct copies of the confirmation of receipt from the	
25	Unite	ed States Postal Service?	
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1	A. That they are.
2	MR. SHEARER: Thank you, Your Honor. I
3	don't have any further questions for Mr. Gilbert. I did
4	forget to ask forget to move to have these exhibits
5	admitted, so I will move to have them all admitted.
6	JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay.

4	A. Yeah, like all reports, the investigator goes
5	out, performs the assignment, and then submits a report.
6	Ultimately, I review it and provide or concur with
7	recommendation.
8	Q. And what are your recommendations and rationale
9	for that recommendation for this docket here today?
10	A. So we follow we have a guideline that we use
11	for carriers that receive unsatisfactory safety ratings.
12	In terms of penalty assessments, we also have a policy
13	that we follow, specifically critical or acute
14	violations. My recommendations follow that policy in
15	both the rating and the penalty.
16	Q. And so what are those recommendations,
17	Mr. Perkinson?
18	A. The recommendations would be to cancel the
19	certificate and impose the penalty of \$6500, which would
20	prohibit the company from operating as a household goods
21	carrier, that would include advertising. If the company
22	were to be found advertising in the future, we would
23	recommend that the Commission classify Urban Delivery
24	LLC in a separate proceeding.
25	Q. And can you speak to the level of cooperation

from Urban Delivery Service with Commission Staff in this case? A. Yeah, so the company generally was uncooperative and untimely. I understand that Mr. Gilbert was able to initially meet with the carrier and then shortly after finding out the outcome of the report, that they became nonresponsive as Mr. Gilbert discussed. Q. And to your knowledge, what action has the company taken to bring its operations into compliance? A.
