**NOTICE RESCHEDULING PREHEARING CONFERENCE  
(Now Set for Thursday, September 10, 2020, at 1:30 p.m.)**

Re: *Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission v. International Resource Management, Inc., d/b/a WasteXpress and d/b/a WasteXpress Hazardous Waste Disposal*, Docket TG-200131

TO ALL PARTIES:

On June 12, 2020, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) entered Order 01, Order Instituting Special Proceeding; Complaint Seeking to Impose Penalties; Notice of Virtual Prehearing Conference (Order 01) in this docket. Order 01, among other things, set the time for a telephonic prehearing conference at 1:30 p.m. on August 20, 2020.

On July 7, 2020, International Resource Management, Inc., d/b/a WasteXpress and d/b/a WasteXpress Hazardous Waste Disposal, (WasteXpress) filed a motion for continuance, requesting that the Commission reschedule the telephonic prehearing conference because WasteXpress's counsel has a scheduling conflict. No party filed a response to the motion.<sup>1</sup>

Pursuant to WAC 480-07-385, "the [C]ommission will grant a continuance if the requesting party demonstrates good cause for the continuance and the continuance will not prejudice any party or the [C]ommission." In the interest of ensuring that WasteXpress's counsel is able to participate in the prehearing conference, and in the absence of any timely objection, the Commission finds good cause to grant the continuance and reschedule the prehearing conference for September 10, 2020, at 1:30 p.m.

**THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE THAT The Commission reschedules the telephonic prehearing conference in Docket TG-200131 for Thursday, September 10, 2020, at 1:30 p.m.**
