Re: DO NOT REDOCKET – Docket UE-240393—Advice 24-02—Schedule 191—System Benefits Charge

At the request of Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission Staff (Staff), PacifiCorp respectfully requests to extend its Schedule 191 System Benefits filing for 30 days to allow Staff more time to review the filing. The new requested effective date is September 1, 2024. The following tariff sheet filed on May 24, 2024, is further revised to include the effective date of September 1, 2024. There are no other changes to the original filing.

Fourth Revision to Sheet No. 191.1 Schedule 191 System Benefits Charge Adjustment

On May 24, 2024, in accordance with RCW 80.28.060, WAC 480-07-880, and WAC Chapter 480-80, PacifiCorp d/b/a Pacific Power & Light Company (PacifiCorp or Company) submitted a revised Schedule 191 tariff sheet applicable to PacifiCorp's electric service in the state of Washington. PacifiCorp requested an effective date of August 1, 2024. Through the May 24<sup>th</sup> filing, PacifiCorp met the requirement below from Docket UE-230904, Order 01, Attachment A, 12 (d):

"Pacific Power must file revisions to its cost recovery tariff, (Schedule 191) by June 1 each year, with the requested effective date of August 1 of that same year."

The May 24<sup>th</sup> filing includes a request to increase the System Benefits Charge (SBC) collection rate, which is administered through Schedule 191 to better align the Company's recovery of costs associated with acquiring and administering cost-effective conservation in its Washington service territory as well as to recover costs associated with demand response programs in Washington and the cost for full time equivalent labor to support Washington equity metrics. Given the request to recover costs associated with demand response programs, Commission Staff asked PacifiCorp to request this extension to allow more time to review the filing.
