- 6 is a filing by TCI Cablevision of Washington, Inc.,
- 7 against U S West Communications, Inc., in which TCI
- 8 contends that U S West's pole attachment rates are too
- 9 high. It's taking place on December 18th, 1995, in
- 10 Olympia, Washington. The parties are appearing by
- 11 telephone conference bridge, and the hearing is being
- 12 held before Administrative Law Judge Marjorie R. Schaer.

- 16 what is the position of the Commission Staff?
- 17 MS. SMITH: The Commission Staff does not
- 18 object to the dismissal or withdrawal of the complaint
- 19 and counterclaim.
- 20 JUDGE SCHAER: And, Mr. McMillan, what is
- 21 the position of ELI?
- MR. McMILLAN: ELI does not object to the
- 23 dismissal of the complaint and the counterclaim.
- JUDGE SCHAER: Well, thank you all for your
- 25 work in resolving this matter, and an order will be
