Q. What is your disposal method?

A. We use Stericycle. The waste is brought to our facility and stored in a locked, secure area. Stericycle picks it up from our facility and, I believe, transports it for disposal at its facility in Morton, Washington.

Q. Is this a satisfactory arrangement?

- A. Yes. It works well for us as it eliminates the need for our employee to make a "long haul," and we are assured that the waste is being properly handled and disposed of.
- Q. Has Consolidated received any citations from the WUTC or other agency related to medical waste in the past five years?
 - A. No.
- Q. Would the granting of this application potentially have an adverse effect on your ability to serve medical waste generators?
- A. Yes. Medical waste obviously is a relatively small part of our overall business. However, we believe we have the obligation pursuant to our permit authority to provide the service at tariff rates. There is a limited number of generators in this area which, other than Ephrata and Moses Lake, is largely rural. There is already a second medical waste service provider in the area (Stericycle), and the addition of a third competitor could, and probably would, diminish our customer count to the point we would have to seek to raise rates or even withdraw from providing the service. We do not want to do either as neither would be in the best interests of our customers.
 - Q. Does this conclude your testimony?
 - A. Yes.
