

Ordering Paragraph No. 3: Qwest Corporation must provide to the Commission and interested persons by Wednesday, October 18, 2006 the most recently filed ARMIS 43-08 data and currently available business line data and number of fiber-based collocators to support the designation of the following wire centers as non-impaired: Kent O'Brien, Olympia Whitehall and Seattle Cherry.

RESPONSE:

Please see Confidential Attachment A which provides business access line quantities in service as of December 31, 2005 in the Kent O'Brien, Olympia Whitehall and Seattle Cherry wire centers, based on the most current ARMIS 43-08 data on file with the FCC. For ease of reference, these quantities are shown by individual product type (e.g.: 800 WATS, Basic Exchange Business, Centrex 21, etc.) for the relevant retail and wholesale services. The quantities associated with the "business" and "public" service categories are subsets of data from the December 31, 2005 ARMIS- 43-08 report. The quantities associated with the remaining categories (UNE-P, UNB Loop and EEL) are from Qwest's wholesale tracking systems and are also December 31, 2005 data.

The number and identity of the fiber-based collocators remains unchanged.
