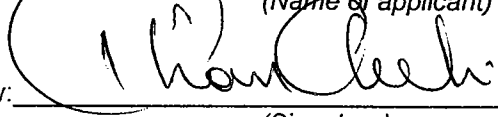

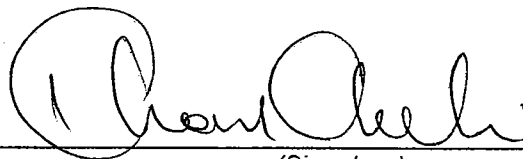

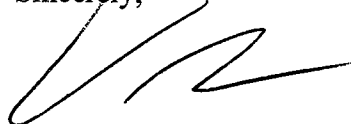

- 32. **Pickup and deliveries** are confined to the city limits of each town/city. Any stops out side the city/town limits must be approved prior to date of travel and a \$5.00 mileage fee will be assessed.
- 33. **Fares:** Fares published are adult fares and apply to passenger who have reached or passed their fourth birthday. Minors may not travel without being accompanied by an adult over 18 years of age.
- 34. **Children's Fares:** Children 3 years of age, or less, when accompanied by an adult passenger and not occupying a seat will be carried free.
- 35. **Additional Persons:** Each fare is based on the first person of each group or part. Any additional person is charged the additional fee each way. The number of persons must be reflected at the time of the reservation. Round trip fare applies only to the first person on the reservation. The group must depart and return the same date, time and location for the additional person rule to apply.
- 36. **Ticket Limitation:** Tickets are valid only for the dates and times provided on the reservations. Cancellations received seven (7) or more days prior to the date of travel will be refunded in full. Cancellations received six (6) or less days prior to the date of travel will be refunded in full minus 10 percent administration fee. Cancellation received within 48 hours of the reservation will be refunded at one-half the total reservation. No-shows or last minute cancellation will not be refunded. Return trip must commence within 31 calendar days of departure date.
- 37. **Intermediate Application:** Fares to or from intermediate points not named herein, will be the same as the fare to or from the next more distant point for which the fare is named.

Reservation Information: It is the responsibility of the customer to provide an accurate address, closest cross streets and/or driving directions to the pickup and delivery destinations.

Management may refuse any request for a reservation that is in conflict with another reservation(s) or out of our service area.

Objectionable passengers: This company reserves the right to refuse to transport persons under the influence of drugs or alcohol, or who are incapable of taking care of themselves, or whose conduct or behavior may be objectionable to other passengers. The carrier also reserves the right to refuse carriage of any materials that the carrier consider unsafe, illegal or not in the best interest of the passengers.

Schedule maintenance: Carrier will not be liable for delay caused by accidents, breakdown, bad road conditions, snow storms or other conditions beyond his control and does not guarantee to arrival at, or departure from any point at any specific time. The company will endeavor to maintain the time of arrival at and departure from any point stated in the reservation, this does not imply a guarantee. The company will not be responsible for delays caused by the customer(s) or conditions beyond his control if any connections are missed.

Shoreline:	I-5 South, then WA-518 West OR WA-99 South to WA-509 South, then WA-518 West to airport
Tukwila:	WA-99 South, then WA-518 West to airport

*Same route applies when traveling in opposite direction (from Airport to Cities), the word west, will be east, and south, will be north.
