UNIT REDEMPTION AGREEMENT

This Agreement (the "Agreement") is made December 26, 2001, among Allen Marine Tours, Inc., an Alaska corporation ("AMT") and Pacific Boat Enterprises, LLC, a Washington limited liability company ("PBE"), with reference to the following facts:

- A. AMT is a member of PBE and was originally issued 500 units of PBE.
- B. The parties desire to provide for PBE's redemption of all AMT's units in PBE.

IT IS AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

1. Redemption/Sale and Consideration. Subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, at the closing, as defined below, AMT agrees to transfer, and PBE agrees to redeem, all of AMT's ownership interest in and units of PBE, including those originally issued and any later acquired, in exchange for PBE's indemnification and hold harmless of AMT from any and all claims that arise in any way from PBE's activities or operations.

2. Closing. The closing shall occur no later than December 31, 2001. At such closing, PBE shall deliver to AMT such resolutions or certificates as counsel for AMT may reasonably require of PBE's approval of this Agreement and the authority of its undersigned representative to execute and deliver this Agreement.

3. Representations. The Seller represents and warrants that it is the owner of the units of PBE, as described above, and that there are no liens, encumbrances, outstanding options, agreements, or commitments of any nature relating to the units, except for this Agreement and PBE's limited liability company agreement.

4. Additional Covenants; Termination of AMT's Obligations under the Limited Liability Company Agreement.

4.1 The parties expressly agree that AMT is relieved of any obligations, duties, or commitments it may have that arise from the PBE's limited liability company agreement, or any amendments to such agreement, and that PBE expressly approves the terms of this Agreement. Additionally, as a part of this Agreement, PBE agrees to indemnify and hold AMT harmless from any and all claims, expenses, costs, or damages of any nature arising from or relating to PBE's activities or operations since its inception through the date of this Agreement.


4.2 As a part of this Agreement, AMT forgives any obligations that Michael Bennett may have under his promissory note owed to AMT in the principal amount of \$50,000.

5. Miscellaneous. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties, their successors and assigns; provided, the rights of the parties shall not be assigned without the prior written consent of all parties. These provisions constitute the entire agreement between the parties and supersede all previous expectations, understandings, communications, representations and agreements, whether verbal or written, with respect to the subject matter,


including, but not limited to, the limited liability company agreement of PBE. Any modification of this Agreement must be in writing and signed by all parties. In any suit, action, or appeal to rescind, enforce or interpret this Agreement or any term or provision of this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover its costs incurred in connection with such suit, action or appeal, including reasonable attorneys fees. This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the state of Washington.

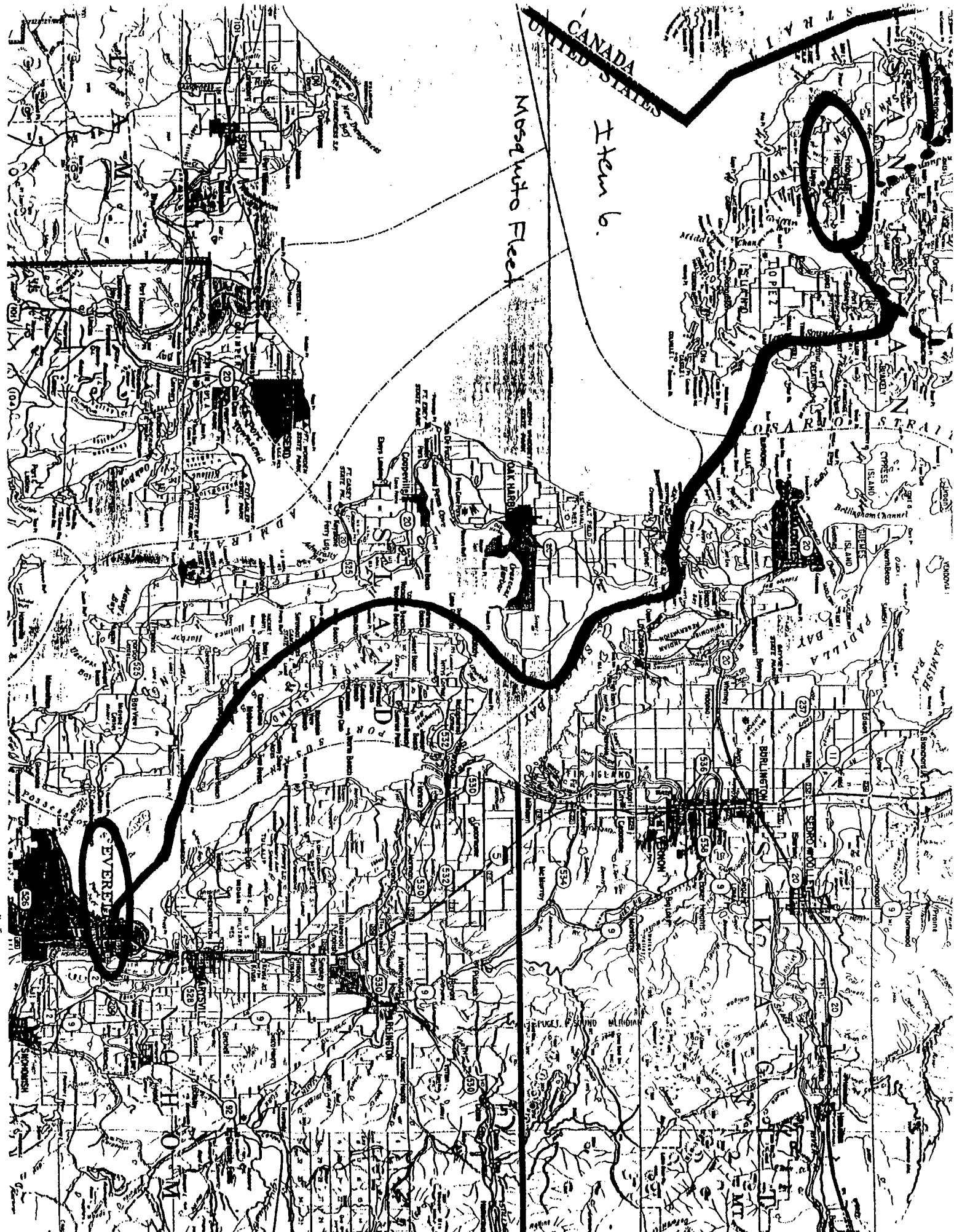
