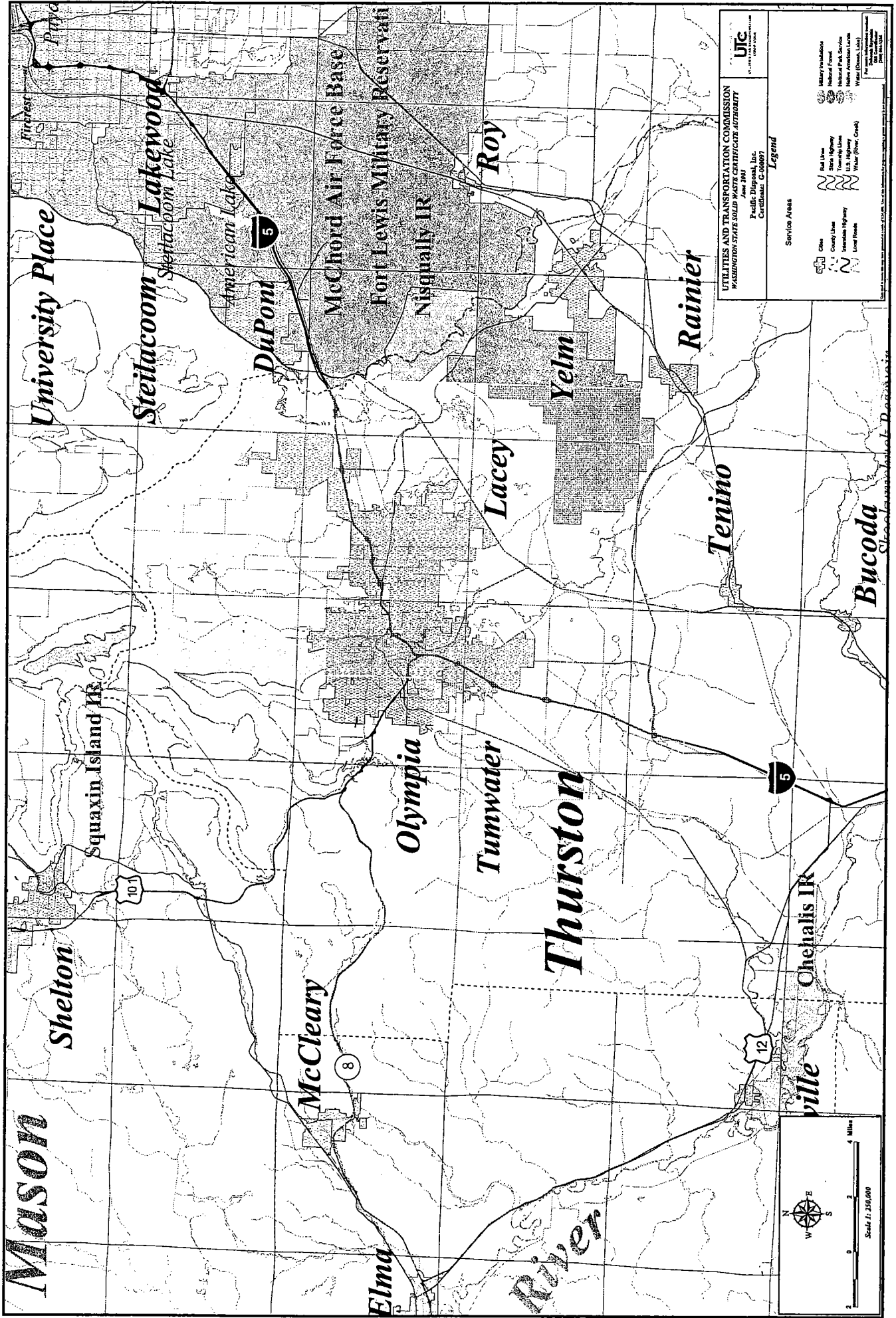



PLAN OF MERGER
LAKWOOD REFUSE SERVICE, INC.

THIS PLAN OF MERGER, effective as of the 1st day of January, 2004 by and between **LAKWOOD REFUSE SERVICE, INC.**, a Washington corporation, and **PACIFIC DISPOSAL, INC.**, a Washington corporation, (the "Merged Corporations"), and **HAROLD LEMAY ENTERPRISES, INC.**, a Washington corporation (the "Surviving Corporation").

RECITALS:

- A. The Merged Corporations are corporations organized and existing under the laws of the state of Washington.
- B. The Surviving Corporation is a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the state of Washington.
- C. The Board of Directors and the shareholders of the Merged Corporations and the Surviving Corporation, respectively, deem it advisable for the Merged Corporations to merge with and into the Surviving Corporation.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein, the Merged Corporations and the Surviving Corporation hereby agree to the following Plan of Merger:

1. Names of Constituent Corporations. Lakewood Refuse Service, Inc. and Pacific Disposal, Inc. will be merged with and into Harold LeMay Enterprises, Inc. Harold LeMay Enterprises, Inc. will be the Surviving Corporation.
2. Terms and Conditions of Merger. Upon the effective date of the merger: the separate corporate existence of the Merged Corporations shall cease; title to all property owned by the Merged Corporations or the Surviving Corporation shall be vested in the Surviving Corporation without reversion or impairment; and the Surviving Corporation shall have all rights and liabilities of the Merged Corporations and the Surviving Corporation. Any proceeding pending by or against the Merged Corporations or the Surviving Corporation may be continued as if such merger did not occur, or the Surviving Corporation may be substituted in the proceeding for the Merged Corporations.
3. Governing Law. The laws of the state of Washington shall govern the Surviving Corporation.
4. Name. The name of the Surviving Corporation shall remain as Harold LeMay Enterprises, Inc.
5. Registered Office and Agent. The address of the registered office of the Surviving Corporation shall remain Nancy Lemay. The registered agent at that address shall remain 13502 Pacific Ave. S., Tacoma, WA 98444-0459.
6. Accounting. The assets and liabilities of the Merged Corporations and the Surviving Corporation as of the effective date of the merger shall be taken up on the books of the Surviving Corporation at the amounts at which they are carried at that time on the respective books of the Merged and Surviving Corporations.

7. Articles of Incorporation/Amendment. The Articles of Incorporation of Harold LeMay Enterprises Inc., as of the effective date of the merger, shall constitute the Articles of Incorporation of the Surviving Corporation.

8. Bylaws. The Bylaws of Harold LeMay Enterprises, Inc., as of the effective date of the merger shall be the Bylaws of the Surviving Corporation until the same shall be altered or amended in accordance with the provisions thereof.

9. Directors and Officers. The directors and officers of Harold LeMay Enterprises, Inc., as of the effective date of the merger shall be the directors and officers of the Surviving Corporation until their respective successors are duly elected and qualified.

10. Manner and Basis of Converting Shares. Upon the Effective Date, each of the issued and outstanding shares of common stock of the Merged Corporations shall be converted into the stock of the Surviving Corporation.. The percentage ownership and identity of the shareholders of the Merged Corporations and the Surviving Corporation are identical, and as such all rights in respect to the shareholders stock in the Merged Corporations shall continue in the same percentage in the Surviving Corporation. No new share certificates in the Surviving Corporation are required.

As we have discussed, Harold LeMay Enterprises, Incorporated is in the process of merging two subsidiaries, Pacific Disposal, Inc. and Lakewood Refuse Service, Inc., into the parent, Harold LeMay Enterprises, Incorporated. U.S. Bank National Association currently has UCC filings on both Pacific Disposal (in Mortgage Docket TG980964) and Lakewood Refuse (in Mortgage Docket TG980963) and understands that the WUTC needs there to be no liens or mortgages outstanding against the two companies in order to allow for the merger to be completed. As the assets of Pacific Disposal and Lakewood Refuse will move to Harold LeMay Enterprises, Inc. with the merger, the bank will amend its existing UCC-3 filings to change the names of Pacific Disposal and Lakewood Refuse to Harold LeMay Enterprises, Inc.

We have had our attorney review this and he believes that this action should eliminate any UCC-3 filings against Pacific Disposal and Lakewood Refuse. This action on the part of the bank will result in the bank releasing all claims against assets owned by Pacific Disposal and Lakewood Refuse.

John,

1. You will need to file two applications, one for each certificate you want to operate pending a commission decision on the existing applications for transfer of permanent authority.
2. You do not need to file the Appendix A in the application packet. I believe there is a line at the bottom of the form that says it is not required with an application for temporary authority to operate a certificate pending transfer.
3. Don't forget to include a tariff adoption form with each temporary application. This is to indicate that LeMay will adopt the existing company tariffs for its operations under the temporary authority.
