Enclosed you will find the original and three copies of the abovereferenced tariff sheets. The purpose of this filing is to accomplish several objectives.

First, the filing increases the charges under Rule 5 for reconnection and discontinuance of service. The charges reflect the actual costs to the Company to perform these services.

The second objective is to increase the minimum charge under Schedule 1 depending upon the size of the meter. The increase is proportional to the equivalent residential units that can be served through the connection. This change affects only Roche Harbor Resort and the Resort already has been

notified of the change and it has not expressed an objection.

The third objective is to delete Schedule 2 dealing with Flat Rate Service.

The fourth objective is to delete Schedule 3 dealing with Fire Flow Service.

The fifth objective is to provide changes to Schedule 4, Connection Charges. The first set of changes is to make the service connection charge and facilities charge apply proportional to the size of the connection. Again, this change affects only Roche Harbor Resort and the Resort has been notified.

The second change to Schedule 4 is to include a new charge to recover the costs of growth for new facilities. Based on the Company's Comprehensive Water Plan, there are two projects that need to be accomplished in the near future. One is the Pearl Island water line, which has an estimated cost of \$45,000.00. This has been revised down from the original costs stated in the Water Plan of \$102,000.00. The second is the construction of the additional Barn Tank at a cost of approximately \$222,000.00. At \$3,000.00 a connection, it will take 89 new connections to raise the funds for these projects. It is expected that there will be approximately 89 new connections over the next several years. The table from the Company's Comprehensive Water Plan that sets out these projects is attached.

The final objective of this filing is to establish a ready to serve charge. Customers who would currently be subject to the ready to serve have been sent a notice.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS AND FINANCING

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

Table 10-7 summarizes the capital improvements previously detailed in Chapter 9 in 2002 costs. The project costs shown in Table 10-7 have been adjusted to reflect future construction costs based on an annual inflationary rate of 3 percent applied from 2002 to the estimated date of construction.

CAPITAL PROJECT FUNDING SOURCES

The Water Company has received financing from its parent ownership in the past. To minimize potential rate impacts, our analysis is based on the funding of capital improvement projects being financed by Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) loans. The DWSRF program offers loans at 1.5% for 20 years. This type of financing is accounted for in the capital revenues and expenditures summarized in Table 10-6 and is reflected in projected future rates.

The Water Company qualifies for the low interest DWSRF loan and should consider applying for this type of financing, available to privately-owned utilities.

Loans up to \$4,000,000 are available from this program, which involves the administration of federal funds by two state agencies, the Department of Health, and the Public Works Board. Applications are due in March of each year. The most recently

Rule 5 – Reconnection Charge

Whenever service has been discontinued due to delinquent account, request of customer, refusal to make proper repairs, failure to comply with these Rules and Regulations, or similar cause, a charge of \$85.00 will be made for restoring service, provided reconnection of the facilities can be completed within the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, except holidays. If reconnection is requested to be made during other than the above hours, the charge shall be \$50.00 per hour. The reconnection charge shall be paid before service is restored.

If the utility dispatches an employee to discontinue service and the customer pays the delinquent amount to the dispatched employee, a \$53.50 service charge may be assessed by the utility to cover expenses incurred. No charge will be made for reconnection of the service if the shut-off was made for the convenience of the utility in making repairs, changes, etc.

Rule 6 – Service Connections

The utility will construct service connections of a proper size, as determined by the utility, from its distribution mains to the applicant's property. The utility reserves the right to refuse to construct a service connection to any property in case a reasonable doubt exists as to continuity of service, or in case the applicant's pipes are not properly constructed and protected.

Rule 21 – Late Payment Charge (Continued)

The late payment charge will not be applied to any disputed amount unless such amount remains unpaid for more than 20 days after the dispute has been resolved.

Rule 22 - Service Visit Charge

A service charge of \$53.50 will apply when the customer requests a second or subsequent service visit and:

(I)

- (1) the cause of the disruption or interruption of the customer's service or degradation of quality is found to be the same cause determined on an earlier service visit (within 90 days of the earlier visit); and
- (2) is on the customer's side of the Point of Delivery.

The company will maintain service records to document that the problem found is the same problem previously encountered. The record will show, at a minimum, the customer's name and address, date of service request, date of service call (if different from the date of service request), type of problem and disposition. The company will notify the customer on the initial service visit (in person or by written notice) when the cause of the problem is on the customer's side and, further, will inform the customer that a subsequent service call which finds the same problem will be billed at tariffed rates. The company will also advise the customer prior to making a second or subsequent service visit that charges will apply if the problem is determined to be the customer's responsibility.

- 3. All work will be commenced upon execution of a written agreement between the utility and the applicant and payment by the applicant, in advance of construction, of all contracted costs. None of the charges under this Schedule are refundable.
