



### **PASSENGER RULES**

Apply to base fares on page 4 and peak season fares on page 5

Adult fares: Published fares are adult fares and apply to passengers who have reached or passed their 16th birthday.

Animals: Generally dogs, cats and other live animals or birds will not be carried. Exception: Service dogs traveling with sight or hearing-impaired passengers will be carried free of charge. Service dogs will not be permitted to occupy a seat, but must lie or stand at the feet of the passenger. Other pets will be transported by prior arrangement with the company. Permitted animals must be housed in pet carriers provided by passenger. All pets will be stowed in the luggage compartment. The following rates apply for the transportation of pets. All pet carrier sizes must comply with the baggage limitations and will be charged a \$5.00 fee.

Child seats: At the discretion of the company the company may provide an approved child seat. If the company provides a child seat a \$5.00 fee will be charged.

Children/Youth: Children under 2 years of age, when accompanied by a ticketed adult passenger, and not occupying a seat, will be carried FREE of charge. Children under 16 years of age, occupying seats qualify for the youth fare and will be charged 50% percent of the adult fare, adding sufficient cents to make the fare end in "0" or "5."

Children 4 years of age and under or less than 40 pounds who occupy a passenger seat should be seated in an approved car child seat provided by the adult passenger. If they occupy a seat they must pay a Youth Fare. All children under 13 must be accompanied by a ticketed adult. Children 13 thru 17, traveling alone, must have a minor release form signed by a parent or guardian.

Commuter Fares: Commuter fares are hereby deleted.

**Employee fares.** The company offers employees and their immediate family, when traveling with the employee, the opportunity to purchase reserved seats at 50% of the regular adult fare or free passage on a stand-by basis.

Frequent User Fares: Passengers traveling 10 round-trips within the preceding 6 months will receive a voucher good for 1 round-trip of the same or lesser value class fare. The voucher has no cash value.

Objectionable passengers: This company reserves the right to refuse to transport persons under the influence of drugs or alcohol, or who are incapable of taking care of themselves, or whose conduct or behavior may be objectionable to other passengers. Oversize, overweight or excess baggage: You may carry 2 full sized bags per paying passenger plus one additional hand-carry and one personal item such as a purse, briefcase or laptop computer. Each full sized bag may weigh up to a maximum of 50 pounds and measure up to 72 linear inches (length + width + height). Bags in excess of 50 pounds or 72 linear inches or in excess of the allowed total number of bags will be accepted on a space-available basis only and will result in a charge \$5 per bag.
