#### **CONCLUSIONS**

ST. NICHOLAS exhibits the typical wash pattern for an aluminum catamaran of its length and displacement. The maximum wash height and energy density occurs at a speed of 17-19 knots followed by a decreasing wash height and energy density, up to 28 knots.

At speeds below 14 knots and above 26 knots, ST. NICHOLAS, at 67.6 long tons, meets the wash acceptability criteria established for Rich Passage in Puget Sound by Washington State Ferries. Compared to other aluminum catamaran vessels, all admittedly larger, ST. NICHOLAS's wash at maximum speed of 28 knots is superior<sup>1</sup>. Note that in the comparison graphs above, SLICE is a novel four-hulled vessel and is not a catamaran.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> ST. NICHOLAS is the lightest catamaran yet tested by us and it is therefore to be expected that its wash profile would be lower than other catamarans tested.
