Pursuant to RCW 80.28.050 and 80.28.060 and the Commission's Rules and Regulations, PacifiCorp dba Pacific Power & Light Company ("PacifiCorp" or "the Company") transmits herewith for filing and approval by the Commission the original and twelve (12) copies of an Application to increase rates, along with two (2) copies of proposed new tariff sheets applicable to electric service supplied by the Company in the state of Washington to become effective on May 27, 2006.

By the enclosed tariff sheets, PacifiCorp requests an increase in revenues from Washington operations not to exceed 2.99 percent for each customer class, or \$7.009 million. Enclosed is Table A showing the impacts of the 2.99% increase to each customer class. Pursuant to WAC 480-07-505(1)(a), this rate filing is not being filed as a "general rate proceeding filing" because it requests an increase of less than three percent. The enclosed tariff sheets are intended to supplement, but not to replace the filed tariff sheets filed in Docket Nos. UE-050684 and UE-050412 (the "Consolidated Dockets"), which tariff sheets are subject to a concurrently-filed Petition for Reconsideration of Order No. 04 in the Consolidated Dockets. The enclosed tariffs increase rates through a rate rider surcharge until such time as reconsideration and appeals have determined the final amount by which base rates should be increased.

Concurrently with this filing, PacifiCorp is submitting a motion in the Consolidated Dockets to further consolidate the docket established for this Application with consolidated Docket Nos. UE-050684 and UE-050412.

APPLICATION

1 Pursuant to RCW 80.28.050, RCW 80.28.060, and in accordance with WAC 480-07-505, PacifiCorp dba Pacific Power & Light Company (“PacifiCorp” or “the Company”) hereby files an application (the “Application”) to adjust prices by an amount not to exceed 2.99 percent for each class of its Washington electric customers, as set forth in the revised tariffs accompanying this Application. Pursuant to WAC 480-07-505(1)(a), this rate filing is not being filed as a “general rate proceeding filing” because it requests an increase of less than three percent. The Application is accompanied by a motion to consolidate the docket established for this Application with consolidated Docket Nos. UE-050684 and UE-050412 (the “Consolidated Dockets”).

2 PacifiCorp is an electrical company and public service company in the State of Washington within the meaning of RCW 80.04.010, and is subject to the Commission’s jurisdiction with respect to its prices and terms of electric service to retail customers in Washington. PacifiCorp provides electric service to approximately 127,000 retail customers in the State of Washington and approximately 1.6 million total retail customers in Washington, California, Idaho, Oregon, Utah, and Wyoming. The Company’s principal place of business is Portland, Oregon.


5 The tariff sheets reflect a proposed effective date of May 27, 2006, which allows the
