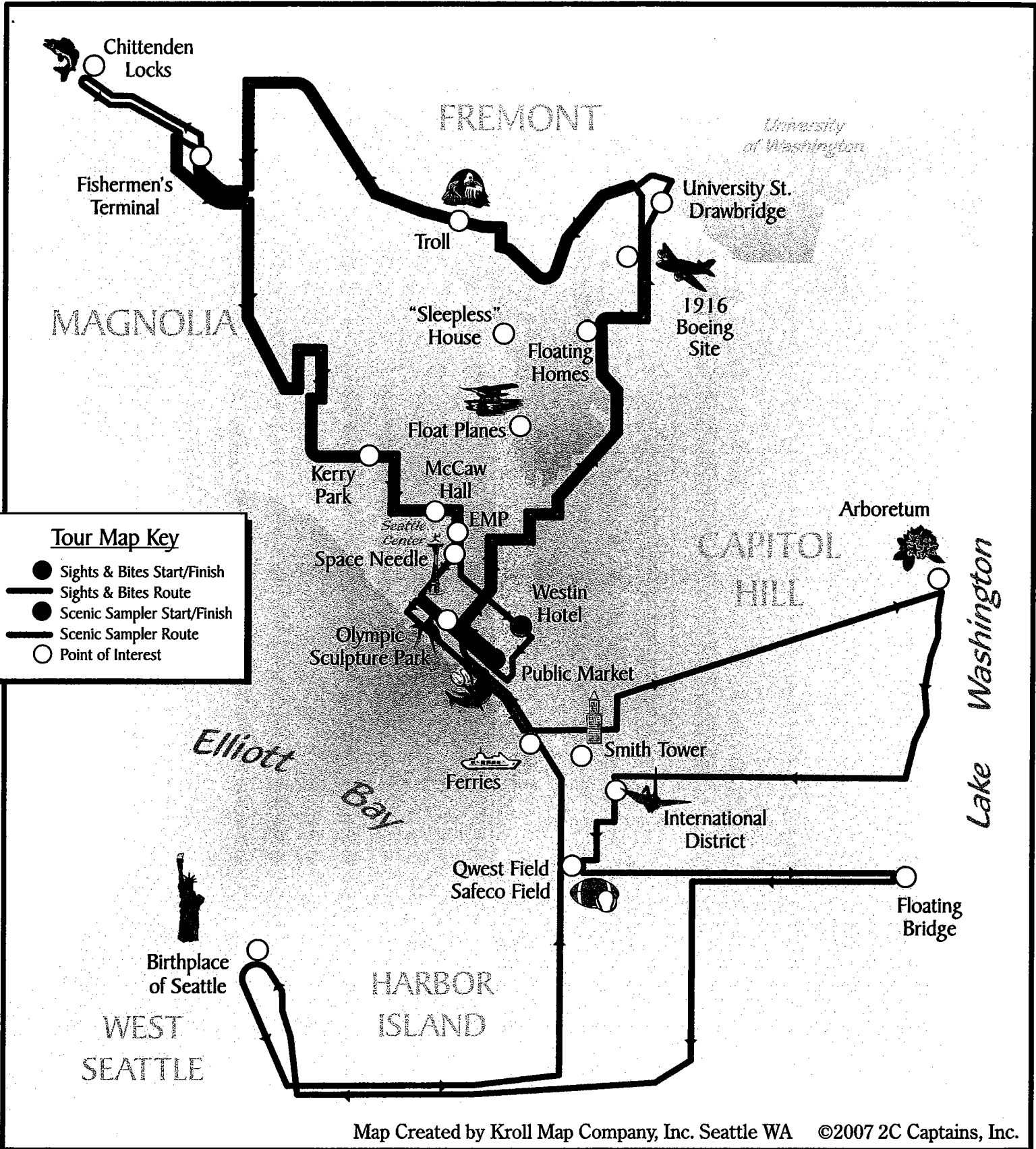

Four-Hour Tour for \$44.00 Adults & \$29.00 for Children:

We do loop from downtown Hotels through Public Market and along Alaska Way, Spokane St and up Admiral Way to West Seattle "Look Out". Then back down Admiral & Spokane to I 5 & I 90 to Floating Bridge. Return via I 90 to exit in International District and down to Pioneer Square for 20-min stop. Then up Yesler Way to Lake Wash Blvd to Madison St and back to 1st Ave to get on the Viaduct to go through Battery St Tunnel and exit on to Valley to Eastlake to cross University Bridge. Thence along Pacific St to Leary Way under, and then across, Ballard Bridge to Fisherman's Terminal. Thence along Commodore Way to Ballard Locks for 20-min observation. We return downtown via Commodore Way, Gillman & Highland Drives, down Queen Ann Ave and 5th Ave to return to hotels. Depending on traffic we stop for 1 hr lunch at Fremont or South Lake Union.
