All Garbage:

12.5 cents per pound, including taxes - \$5.00 minimum charge

Household Recycling:

No Charge

If you bring in both garbage and recycling, you must weigh for each item or you may pay the whole load at garbage rates but still recycle.

Other Charge Items:

Appliances: \$20 each

Refrigerators: \$50 each

Propane Tanks: \$1.00 per gallon

Tires: \$4.00 each

Branches and Yard-waste: 3.5 cents per pound - \$3.00 minimum charge

Grass, weeds and leaves, branches, brush, stumps and land-clearing debris: no garbage, no plastic bags, no construction wood or metal wires.

Loads mixed with garbage will be charged as garbage.

Construction Waste: 12.5 cents per pound

Mixed Construction Waste:

All construction waste: wood, plastic, insulation, roofing, etc. No sheetrock, dirt, yardwaste, or garbage

Fluorescent light-bulbs: Contain mercury and cannot be disposed of in the garbage, please hand directly to the station attendant.

Car Batteries: Are accepted year round, we do charge the garbage rate for the weight.

Used Motor Oil and Heating Oil: Is accepted year round, please bring in a screw top container and give to station attendant. For large quantities or heating oil tank disposal please call.

SELF-HAUL RECYCLING PROGRAM

Station Hours:

Sunday through Thursdays

Noon to 4:00 pm

Cost: Recycling is FREE to all households

Business recycling with large volumes charged 5 cents per pound

Things to Remember:

- Recycling actually costs us. Processors charge to take materials for sorting; currently glass, plastic and tin cans cost \$100.00 per ton delivered. It also costs us to handle the materials, provide containers and to haul recyclables to processors. We provide this as a community service, please do what you can to help by properly preparing your recyclables.
- Keep your recycling clean, remember you could someday eat out of a container made from it.
- If it is garbage, don't put it into the recycling, it drives up the cost to process materials and can ruin whole loads of recyclables.
- Please don't use free recycling as an opportunity to dump garbage on us, please pay for your garbage disposal.
- You do not have to weigh your recycling on the scale; **if it is safe** to drive by the scale you may do so, please watch traffic and drive slowly and considerately.

Recyclable Materials: 3-Stream System

NO PLASTIC BAGS – Recyclables must be loose for sorting

MIXED CONTAINERS

(All together in one bin)

Glass Bottles and Jars:

Clean, no food residue, remove lids

Tin Cans:

Rinsed clean, labels removed

Plastic Bottles and Tubs: All plastic bottles and plastic tubs. **Remove lids and flatten**.

No other plastics, No Styrofoam, No plastic cartons.

Aluminum Beverage Cans: Keep separate, they have their own storage bin.

Please flatten if you can.

PAPER

Paper is placed in the 3-yard dumpsters- then stored in the backup garbage truck- then recycled

Cardboard: Flatten all boxes – No waxed cardboard or pizza boxes.

Mixed Paper: No paper that has had direct contact with food. Newspaper, magazines, office paper, cartons. No waxed paper such as milk cartons or freezer cartons.

WE DO NOT RECYCLE:

Dirty Recyclables, Film Plastics, Styrofoam and Packing Peanuts.

Keep packing peanuts in a bag or box for garbage, do not let them get free.
