The Town Toyota Regional Events Center is a 4300 fixed seat multi-purpose events center that is an anchor to a rapidly developing waterfront district. The center sits across the BNSF mainline from the several large commercial developments and parking areas. The city and district are working on a long term solution of a pedestrian overpass, however in the interim fencing is needed to secure the site and provide for overall safety

The Town Toyota Regional Events Center is located on the easterly Burlington Northern right of way as shown in the attached pictures. The pedestrian route is significantly longer in distance following the street network and therefore the tendency to trespass is great. BNSF police and the Events Center Security have been patrolling the area to deter trespassing until a fence can be installed.

2. Provide a detailed description of the proposed project and explain how it will eliminate or mitigate the hazard. Include any drawings or construction plans for the proposed project.

The proposed project will provide fencing as shown in the attached drawing. This fencing will prevent direct access to the tracks by pedestrians.

The total cost of the project is estimated to be \$20,000 for 850 lineal feet of fencing. The City of Wenatchee will participate as necessary with in kind labor to ensure that the cost estimate of \$20,000 is attainable.

5. Provide an estimated timeline of project, if approved.

The project will be constructed within two months of approval.

6. Provide a description of how the project's success would be measured.

Project success will be measured by monitoring the reduction in trespassing occurrences observed by security staff.

7. Provide any other information the applicant believes would be useful to the commission in considering the project.

BNSF approached the public facilities district and the city regarding the hazard soon after the center opened. Trespassing had been reported within the first few events. BNSF, WUTC, Public Facility District, and City representatives met on site in January of 2009 to review the site and problem area. The location of the fence was discussed and the amount of fencing required was measured at that meeting.
