 This site presents significant safety concerns. It presents an easy access to the

beach as the shoulders of the road that provides access to the old Meadowdale Marine (decaying and not used as a business for many years) provide ample parking for several cars. Many use this crossing not only for direct access to the beach but also as a shortcut along the tracks to the neighboring Meadowdale County Park approximately ½ mile north. The parking, trespassing, partying and noise has created many confrontations with neighbors and call outs to the Edmonds Police Department, especially in good weather. According to BNSF Police and neighborhood discussions there have been 3 fatalities at this site in recent years with the most recent about 5 years ago.

The proposed project will be approximately 350 feet of 8 foot, 9 guage, green chain link fence with a 30 foot locked and rolling gate. It is to be installed at the base of the slope 30 feet from the eastern edge of the furthest east track. We believe with the difficulty of the slope, the preponderance of blackberries up to many potions of the fence, and angling the fence up at both ends will provide a deterrent to all but the most dedicated efforts to cross at this site. Please see attached preliminary drawing of the site.

Total cost of the project from BNSF estimates is \$70,000.

Total GCPF grant funds requested is \$20,000.

 Names of parties contributing to the project and the amount each is contributing.

The City of Edmonds will be paying the complete cost of the fence including installation.

 City of Edmonds Public Works and Parks Department will be responsible for long-term maintenance

 We have begun work with BNSF's real estate contractor for a lease application to lease this portion of their right-of-way. Following legal review and acceptance of the lease by both parties the City will be ready to construct the fence

immediately. We are hopeful that this will be accomplished before June 1st, 2009.

- 6. Provide a description of how the project's success would be measured.

 We believe that the most important measure will be a dramatic reduction in police response calls to the area. Pedestrian accidents and near misses should be almost eliminated at this site and anecdotal information from the neighbors will also be an important measure.

 We have met on-site with neighbors, BNSF safety and police officials, City of Edmonds Police, Engineering, planning and Parks Department as well as the owner of the marina and there is no disagreement that this project's time has

The City of Edmonds is hoping to construct a small overlook park above this site this summer that will be a chance for citizens to enjoy the views and smells of the sound without having the attraction of the crossing and walking the tracks to the beach.
