Cancellation of Tariff Schedule No. 108 - Energy Star New Homes Incentive

Program

Dear Mr. Danner:

Pursuant to RCW 80.28.050, RCW 80.28.060, WAC 480-80-121(1), PacifiCorp, d.b.a. Pacific Power, ("PacifiCorp" or "Company") submits for filing the following tariff sheets, which the Company proposes to cancel. The Company respectfully requests that the cancellation of these tariff sheets become effective on June 17, 2009.

Canceling First Revision of Sheet No. 108.1 Schedule 108 Energy Star New Homes Incentive Program

Canceling Third Revision of Sheet No. 108.2 Schedule 108 Energy Star New Homes Incentive Program

The Energy Star New Homes program was approved by the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission ("Commission") with an effective date of April 1, 2005¹. The program offers participating home builders financial incentives, cooperative advertising funds, sales and technical support and training in order to encourage and assist builders in offering new homes that meet Energy Star standards. The program is offered to builders constructing new homes and multi-family residences in PacifiCorp's Washington service territory.

As reported previously², the program has not achieved the performance levels projected when the program was initially approved by the Commission in April 2005. The Company concluded it was necessary to seek other program design or delivery options. In late 2007, the Company issued a request for proposals seeking input on how to improve the Company's energy efficiency measures offered for new homes. Upon receipt of the proposals, the Company analyzed the responses and developed a proposal which was communicated to the Washington Demand Side

Management Advisory Group ("DSM Advisory Group") at their October 7, 2008 meeting. The proposal included the following:

- Add energy efficiency measures for new homes to the existing Home Energy Savings program, Tariff Schedule No. 118.
- Cancel the Energy Star New Homes program offered under Tariff Schedule No. 108 after the measures for new homes are made available through the Home Energy Savings program.

On February 25, 2009, the Company emailed the DSM Advisory Group to request comments on the proposed changes that were initially discussed at the October 2008 meeting. As no comments opposing the proposed changes were received, the energy efficiency measures for new homes were added to the existing Home Energy Savings program on April 1, 2009. The new homes measures added to the Home Energy Savings program include both a whole home package that meets Energy Star certification requirements and individual measures³. The Company is now requesting the cancellation of the Energy Star New Homes program offered through Tariff Schedule No. 108.
