Subject: Kalan Industrial Lead Track in Kennewick

We met on-site July 15, 2009 to discuss the track and rail crossings on the Kalan Industrial Lead in Kennewick. The meeting was the result of Jim Thoelke's efforts to "Exempt" the crossing at N Washington Street so that Ben Franklin Transit buses would not have to stop at what appeared to an out-of-service rail crossing.

At the meeting, we determined that there were seven public crossings on track that had not been used for a long time. Three of the crossings, N Dayton Street, N Benton Street, and N Washington Street apparently are owned by Union Pacific Railroad and the other four, N Beech Street, N Cedar Street, N Date Street, and E Bruneau Avenue are apparently owned by the Port of Kennewick. Everything I have seen since the meeting seems to support this ownership split.

At the meeting, we explored the idea of formally abandoning the line, removing the track, and closing the crossings. Larry Peterson said the Port could not support this idea for its tracks and crossings but Terrel Anderson thought UPRR might be willing to do so on some its track.

Terrel followed up with UPRR management and found that UPRR could not support abandoning the track and crossings either.

So, that leaves us with Jim Thoelke's original idea to install exempt signs on the N Washington Street Crossing. Terrel indicates that UPRR will support a petition to install exempt signs at N Washington with the caveat that the signs would have to be removed if UPRR resumes operations on this line.

As far as I know, all parties favor of the exempt signs, including UTC staff. Under our process, only the road authority (city of Kennewick) or the railroad can file a petition for installation of exempt signs. I think it would appropriate in this case for the city to file the petition. I have a draft petition that was prepared by the Port. I will modify that draft to meet our standards and forward it to the city for signature. I'm assuming Dan Kaufman has authority to sign on behalf of the city. If that is not correct, please let me know so that I can include the right information in the petition.

I also think it might be a good idea to install exempt signs on N Benton Street. Jim indicated that transit buses use this crossing occasionally and it makes no sense for them to stop because there are no train operations. I will draft a petition for this crossing also. If anybody along the way objects, we can drop the idea.
