## GRADE CROSSING PROTECTIVE FUND 2009 – 2011 GRANT APPLICATION OPEN CALL FOR PROJECTS

The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (commission), through its Grade Crossing Protective Fund (GCPF), provides grants for projects that eliminate or mitigate public safety hazards at railroad crossings and along railroad rights-of-way in Washington State. Any public, private or non-profit entity may submit an application to the commission for a GCPF grant.

To apply for a grant to eliminate or mitigate a public safety hazard at a railroad crossing or along a railroad right-of-way, complete the following information and submit it and attachments to the commission.

## **Project Information**

Attach additional sheets as necessary to the application that provide the following:

1. A detailed summary of the hazard being addressed. Include any information about accidents or incidents at the site and photographs, drawings or other materials that support the application. Most, if not all, UPRR grade crossings in Washington that have automatic signals are equipped with incandescent 8" or 12" flashing lights. These lights have served us well over the years but newer 12' LED lenses are substantially more visible to motorists and are more dependable.

- 2. A detailed summary of the proposed project and how it will eliminate or mitigate the hazard. Include any drawings or construction plans for the proposed project. UPRR has partnered with rail safety agencies in Utah, Nevada, Oregon, and Arizona to retrofit all automatic signals with LED lenses. This is a very low cost safety improvement and UPRR proposes to provide the labor if UTC, through the GCPF, will fund purchase of materials. UPRR has found that it is most efficient to upgrade a whole line as opposed to selecting individual crossings at various locations around the state. Because GCPF grants are generally limited to \$20,000 per project, UPRR, in consultation with UTC staff, has selected the Ayer Sub in eastern Washington as the first line to upgrade. This line has 13 grade crossings in Washington equipped with automatic signals: six with shoulder-mounted flashers only; two with cantilever-mounted flashers; four with shoulder-mounted gates and flashers; and one with cantilever-mounted gates and flashers. There are eight crossings in Walla Walla County; two in Adams County; One in Lincoln County; and two in Spokane County.
- 3. A list all other companies, organizations, state agencies or local governments that may be involved in implementing this proposal and the contact name, address and phone number for each (if known).*N/A*
- 4. A cost estimate, including:
  - a. An itemized list of the total costs of the project. The total cost of materials for the project is detailed in the attachment.
  - b. Names of parties contributing to the project, including the applicant, and the amount each is contributing. *UPRR will provide labor to install the lenses*.
- 5. The name of the party responsible for long-term maintenance, such as repair of fencing. *UPRR will maintain the lenses after installation*.
- 6. An estimated timeline of the project. *UPRR signal maintainers will install the new lenses as part of their regular work. This line upgrade will be completed by 6/15/2011.*
- 7. A description of how the project's success would be measured. *The lenses at all grade crossings on this line have been installed and are operational.*
- 8. Any other information the applicant believes would be useful to the commission in considering the project.
