This report sets forth the information required by WAC 480-90/100-262 for the securities transactions of Avista Corporation (“Avista” or “Company”) during calendar year 2010.

**SECURITIES ISSUED:**

**Issuance of Short-Term Debt**

The following table is a summary of borrowings under the Company’s \$320 million credit facility for the 12 months ended 12/31/2010. The proceeds were used for daily working capital purposes, general corporate purposes, and other purposes allowed by RCW 80.08.040. There were no direct fees or expenses paid in connection with the issuance of short-term debt in 2010.

## Issuance of Long-Term Debt

In December 2010, we issued \$52.0 million of 3.89 percent First Mortgage Bonds due in 2020 and \$35.0 million of 5.55 percent First Mortgage Bonds due in 2040.

Also in December 2010, we issued \$50.0 million of 1.68 percent First Mortgage Bonds due in 2013. The net proceeds from the issuance of the Bonds of \$49.8 million (net of placement agent fees and before our expenses) were used to repay a portion of the borrowings outstanding under our committed line of credit.

## Use of Proceeds

The total net proceeds from the sale of the of 3.89 percent First Mortgage Bonds due in 2020 and 5.55 percent First Mortgage Bonds due in 2040 of \$86.6 million (net of placement agent fees and before our expenses) were used to redeem \$45.0 million of 6.125 percent First Mortgage Bonds due in December 2013 and \$30.0 million of 7.25 percent First Mortgage Bonds due in September 2013. These First Mortgage Bonds were redeemed at par plus a make-whole redemption premium of \$10.7 million. In accordance with regulatory accounting practices, the make-whole redemption premium will be amortized over the life of the new debt issued.

The net proceeds of the 1.68 percent First Mortgage Bonds due in 2013 of \$49.8 million (net of placement agent fees and before our expenses), together with other available funds were used to pay down short-term borrowings outstanding under our \$320 million credit facility, which was replaced in February 2011.

### Issuances of Common Stock

During 2010, the Company issued a total of 230,266 new shares of common stock through the Dividend Reinvestment Plan, the 401(K) plan and the Long-Term incentive plan. The total net proceeds of \$3,463,929 under the plans were used for capital expenditures. There are no direct fees or expenses paid in connection with the issuance of the Common Stock with regards to these plans through December 31, 2010.

The Company also issued shares through its periodic offering program amounting to 2,054,110 shares were issued under during 2010. The total net proceeds under the periodic program were \$43,174,162.

### Use of Proceeds

The total net proceeds of \$46.2 million under the plans were used pay down short term borrowings, general corporate purposes, and other purposes allowed by RCW 80.08.030.

### Level of Expenses

There are no direct fees or expenses paid in connection with the issuance of the Common Stock with regards to the Dividend Reinvestment Plan, the 401(K) plan and the Long-Term incentive plan through December 31, 2010.

In December 2010, \$66.7 million and \$17 million of the City of Forsyth, Montana Pollution Control Revenue Refunding Bonds (Avista Corporation Colstrip Project) due 2032 and 2034 respectively, which had been held by Avista Corp. since 2008 and 2009, were refunded by new bond issues (Series 2010A and Series 2010B). The new bonds were not offered to the public and were purchased by Avista Corp. due to market conditions. The Company expects that at a later date, subject to market conditions, these bonds will be remarketed to unaffiliated investors.

In addition to the Pollution Control Bonds \$45.0 million of 6.125 percent First Mortgage Bonds due in December 2013 and \$30.0 million of 7.25 percent First Mortgage Bonds due in September 2013 were redeemed on December 20, 2010 at par plus a make-whole redemption premium of \$10.7 million. In accordance with regulatory accounting practices, the make-whole redemption premium will be amortized over the life of the new debt issued.
