## Pricing basis or costing method:

## Services

Tariffed Rates – If a service provided between affiliates is covered by a tariff on file with a federal or state commission, the transaction is recorded at that tariffed rate.

Publicly Filed Agreements – If a service provided between affiliates is a non-tariffed service covered by a publicly filed agreement, then the transaction is recorded using the rates found in the publicly filed agreement.

Prevailing Price – If a prevailing price exists for a service transferred between affiliates, then the purchasing entity records the transaction at the prevailing price.

Lower of Fair Market Value or Fully Distributed Cost – If neither a tariff rate, publicly filed agreement nor a prevailing price applies, then services purchased from an affiliate are recorded at the lower of fair market value or fully distributed cost.

Higher of Fair Market Value or Fully Distributed Cost - If neither a tariff rate, publicly filed agreement nor a prevailing price applies, then services sold to an affiliate are recorded at the higher of fair market value or fully distributed cost.

Fully Distributed Cost - Affiliates which exist solely to provide services to Frontier's corporate family will continue to bill at fully distributed cost.

## <u>Assets</u>

Tariffed Rates - Assets sold or transferred between affiliates pursuant to existing tariffs, including a tariff filed with a state commission, are recorded in the appropriate revenue accounts at the tariff rate.

Prevailing Price - Non-tariffed assets sold or transferred between affiliates that qualify for prevailing price valuation are recorded at the prevailing price.

Lower of Fair Market Value or Net Book Cost - All other assets purchased from affiliates are recorded at no more than the lower of fair market value or net book cost.
