Dear Mr. Danner:

Pursuant to RCW 80.28.050, RCW 80.28.060, WAC 480-100-193 and WAC 480-100-195 PacifiCorp, d.b.a. Pacific Power & Light Company (PacifiCorp or Company), submits for filing in electronic format a proposed tariff sheet revision to Schedule 135-Net Metering Service. The Company respectfully requests an effective date of August 1, 2012.

The purpose of this filing is to revise Schedule 135 to include provisions which allow customers to participate in net meter aggregation consistent with RCW 80.60.030(4)(a-d). Consistent with RCW 80.60.030(4)(a-d), Schedule 135 allows for customer-generator meter aggregation with kilowatt-hour credits earned by a net metering system. Not more than a total of one hundred kilowatts of net metering system capacity are allowed to be aggregated under Schedule 135 and any excess kilowatt-hour credits earned during the same billing period are equally credited to remaining meters located on all premises of a customer-generator at the designated rate of each meter. A customer-generator will be charged an aggregation basic charge for each aggregated meter that is equal to the basic charge or load size charge (as applicable) in the schedule under which the aggregated meter is billed.

In compliance with WAC 480-100-193 and WAC 480-100-195, the Company has posted a complete copy of this tariff and the proposed changes on our website and has provided a toll-free number by which customers can obtain assistance. In addition, PacifiCorp has provided physical access to the tariff and the proposed changes at one or more offices in each county where the Company offers service.
