Comment by Mason County in Support of Revenue Retention

Dear Mr. Danner:

I am the "Acting" Mason County Solid Waste Manager and write in that capacity to certify Mason County Garbage Company's compliance with the local Solid Waste Management Plan. The County's Plan outlines the recycling strategies the County and our local hauler will work collaboratively to provide for the residents of the Mason County community. The proposed plan for revenue sharing demonstrates, through various, multiple methods, how the revenues will be used to increase recycling in order for Mason County Garbage to qualify for the 30% revenue share retention authorized by state law.

Mason County Garbage has demonstrated to the satisfaction of the County that its solid waste and recycling collection system in 2011 and 2012 has achieved the goals and objectives outlined in the Solid Waste Management Plan, the Revenue Sharing Plan and the applicable Mason County Ordinance, #147-08 which is adopted in the County Code as chapter 13.30.90. The revenue share issue was reviewed in some depth and there was consensus that the hauler's obligations thereunder were being met in accordance with the approved plan. To repeat, it is the consensus of Mason County that Mason County Garbage is entitled to the full 30% revenue retention set forth in the Plan, Ordinance, and as permitted under RCW 81.77.185.

- 1. Mason County Garbage has complied with reporting requirements as stated in Mason County Ordinance, #147-08 which is adopted in the County Code as chapter 13.30.90.
- 2. Mason County Garbage has achieved an increase in recycling materials from the prior reporting period.
- 3. Mason County Garbage continues to assist Mason County Utilities and Waste Management with recycling glass at their transfer stations.
- 4. Mason County Garbage has demonstrated using their share of commodity credit to promote recycling throughout Mason County.

Thank you for your consideration. Accountability is important to our customers, and their satisfaction is everyone's priority. It is with this in mind that this letter is submitted. Please contact me if you have other questions or concerns, or if I can be of further assistance.

Re: 2012-2013 Continued Revenue Share Plan Mason County Garbage

Dear John,

We wanted to take this opportunity to update you on the continued success of the curbside recycling program that Mason County Garbage first implemented in 2009. Mason County adopted Ordinance #147-08, in response to RCW 81.77.185, thus resulting in a curbside recycling program in Mason County. There was an extensive plan, implementation schedule, reporting criteria and revenue sharing agreement as part of this recycling program.

To coincide with our reported success of this program, we are also requesting that we still be considered to participate in the Revenue Sharing portion of this agreement. Per the agreement, we would be authorized to retain 30% of the commodity revenue provided certain criteria and goals were met. The revenue sharing program is broken down into three components, which we will outline and address below:

Ten percent of the commodity revenue is retained for assisting the County in recycling glass by providing hauling services, at the County transfer stations. The company continues to provide this service for the County.

Ten percent of the commodity revenue will be received for meeting or exceeding data monitoring and reporting requirements. We have collected and accurately reported recycling and garbage data. We established baseline information with which to measure the performance of this program.





The company retains ten percent of the commodity revenue for achieving and demonstrating a recycling increase of per household per month, year-over-year. Since 2009, households are recycling more material resulting in overall reduction in garbage tonnage generation. For the upcoming reporting year, 2012-2013, we will continue to promote recycling as an alternative to solid waste service and demonstrate that performance by a year to year reduction in service level and increase in recycling and frequency of pickups using as our benchmark criterion, the core service level can size of 32 gallons.

We believe we are working well with the community and Mason County to continue promotion of the program as it has evolved, and, as interpreted by the WUTC in recent months. We would request that we be allowed to continue the revenue share portion of the agreement and retain thirty percent of the revenue from commodity sales and for expenditure of funds pursuant to the proposed attached budget.
